One of the practices I hope I will be able to integrate into my life as a result of being Moderator is heeding call of James 1:19: "Let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger..." The Jesus who invited his followers to turn the other cheek when insulted, and himself did not respond when falsely accused.
