

It's Epiphany! The Greek word *epiphania* means "manifestation." An Epiphany is a sudden revelation or realization about the nature or meaning of something. In a happy set of circumstances, this year the Epiphany, January 6, falls on a Sunday. This is the day of the year that we celebrate the Incarnation of God into the person of Jesus Christ. From the Incarnation flows everything else in our faith: the teaching of Jesus Christ, the Crucifixion, and the Resurrection. Without the Incarnation, these things do not happen. Part of the power that comes from Epiphany is where it is placed in our liturgical season, for to get to Epiphany, we must go through Advent. We have gone through four weeks of fasting, repentance and darkness to get to the light of Epiphany. And so, we begin 2019 with Epiphany. That's a good way for the church to be reminded that Christianity is a revealed religion.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

PASSING THE PEACE: Perhaps you have wondered why we "Pass the Peace of Christ" during Sunday worship in church. *"Passing the Peace"* is an ancient tradition going back to the early church, whereby brothers and sisters in Christ share a hug or handshake, or a *"holy kiss,"* as a sign of our love. Often the embrace is accompanied by a wish for the *"peace of Christ"* to be with another. (This is often said out loud as hugs or handshakes are exchanged.) It is also a sign that we have reconciled wrongs with one another and with anyone who might be holding something against us.
