**Passing of the Peace: Post-game handshakes are a time-honored tradition. Baseball players, basketball players, NFL athletes never miss this ritual of sportsmanship. February has become known as Black History Month, or African Heritage Month. Over the next few weeks some of our music, anthems and hymns will reflect the influence that Black History has had on our music and culture. A

special treat will be a brass ensemble joining us for service on February 24.

The commemoration of African Heritage Month in Canada can be traced to 1926 when Harvard-educated black historian Carter G. Woodson, who founded Negro History Week to recognize the achievements of African Americans. Woodson purposefully chose February for the birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln, both key figures in the emancipation of enslaved blacks: In 1976, as part of the American Bicentennial celebrations, Negro History Week was expanded to Black History and is now recognized here in Canada as African Heritage Month.

We continue African Heritage Month by celebrating Viola Desmond, who built a career and business as a beautician and was a mentor to young Black women in Nova Scotia through her Desmond School of Beauty Culture. It is, however, the story of her courageous refusal to accept an act of racial discrimination that provided inspiration to a later generation of Black persons in Nova Scotia and in the rest of Canada. In December 2016, it was announced that Desmond would be the first Canadian woman depicted on the face of a Canadian banknote — the \$10 note in a series of bills released in 2018.
