From the Organist's Desk: We will soon be moving back in to the sanctuary for worship and please consider why we moved. The Worship & Music Committee made the suggestion after noting that congregational singing is easier and more effective when people are seated closer together. As worshiping followers of Jesus, members of all congregations are encouraged to raise their voices in praise and song. It is a Biblical imperative (eg: Psalm 96: Sing to the Lord a new song...", Psalm 100: "Make a joyful noise...", and more) which is made easier to follow when a congregation sings together. The choir is a group of singers who are willing to spend extra time learning and preparing music that enhances our worship experience, but the primary responsibility of any church choir is to lead and support congregational singing. In other words, the choir is helping to develop a "congregational choir", not just an audience. When that happens, the effects are powerful and lasting. Thanks!
