Sermon: "A New Way"

Deuteronomy 2: 1-3

Then we turned back and set out toward the wilderness along the route to the Red Sea, as the LORD had directed me. For a long time we made our way around the hill country of Seir.



2Then the LORD said to me, 3"You have made your way around this hill country long enough; now turn north. 4Give the people these orders: 'You are about to pass through the territory of your relatives the descendants of Esau, who live in Seir. They will be afraid of you, but be very careful. 5Do not provoke them to war, for I will not give you any of their land, not even enough to put your foot on. I have given Esau the hill country of Seir as his own. 6You are to pay them in silver for the food you eat and the water you drink.'"

Galatians 4: 4-7

4 But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, 5 in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. 6 And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our[b] hearts, crying, "Abba![c] Father!" 7 So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.[d]

The Children of Israel had suffered so much in Egypt

They were stripped of their culture and religious faith

The were forced to adopt every practice and way of life of the Egyptians

They were slaves who were being brutally slaughtered by cruel task masters, in fact many died under bricks and columns that fell on them while they were being beaten and forced to build vast buildings.

The Lord saw their plight and rescued them.

Led them out of Egypt, took them across the Red Sea.

According to scholars:

Their journey from Egypt to Sinai took 1 year, 1 month and 1 week exactly

They left Sinai and made about 20 stops along the way until they arrived at Kadesh Barnea. This journey took them 11 months exactly.



They arrived at Kadesh 24 months after leaving Egypt and to mark their arrival at kadesh they celebrated their 3rd Passover. (Numbers 20:1)

They spend 38 continuous years at Kadesh Barnea (they do not leave and come back), then depart for the Jordan in the 40th year.

On their way to Canaan, they spent 38 years in one place

- At some point they had to move on, they had to move towards their goal as they could not stay in the same place for any longer.
- They had a God directed destination and it was time to move toward it.
- Why was God giving them this new command at this time in their lives?
- They had spent enough time at a place where they had become complacent and somehow lost their focus.

What is God's message to us on this first Sunday of the year and how do we interpret God's command to Israel as they camped on the periphery of the promised land.

- They had wandered long enough and had waited long enough at Kadesh and now their time had come to move into the great promised that was awaiting them.
- It was a command that was so clear that they knew their time had come.
- It was time for deliverance just as it was in the days when Jesus made his entry into our lives.

- 2. They were given a direct command by God to move and they could only obey because they trusted God
- When we trust God we know that his command will only bring us to a better place in our lives.
- When we trust God we give ourselves in entirety to him knowing that our all is in God's hands
- As we begin this new year we will make plans and have aspirations where we will have to trust God for direction.
- 3. The were instructed not to get distracted with fights and opposition to those along the way.

4-7"You are about to pass through the territory of your brethren, the descendants of Esau, who live in Seir; and they will be afraid of you. Therefore watch yourselves carefully. Do not meddle with them, for I will not give you any of their land, no, not so much as one footstep, because I have given Mount Seir to Esau as a possession

9Then the Lord said to me, "Do not harass the Moabites or provoke them to war, for I will not give you any part of their land. I have given Ar to the descendants of Lot as a possession."

- Too often on our way forward we get side tracked by things that cause us to lose focus.
- We are going to come in contact with people on our journey where we must quickly discern what they are about and how we must keep moving in spite of our contact with them.
- Sometimes the distractions are our own doing as we have too many questions about the way that God has already made.

Lets go forward with God as it is God's plan for our lives that will bear fruition our northward journey. Trust in God is very critical to our progress because we are going to hear so many negative things as we live our lives. There are so many points of view that will sound very



informed but are in no way spiritual. It is critical that we understand how God's will unfolds and how our obedience enables God's will to unfold before us.

The wise man King Solomon says in Proverbs 3:5-6"

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths."


