Sermon: "Joy in the Lord"

Text: Philippians 4: 4-9

4 Rejoice[c] in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice.[d] 5 Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. 6 Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

8 Finally, beloved, [e] whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about[f] these things. 9 Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Today on the third Sunday of Advent we focus on joy. The focus on joy at advent was heralded by the angels' announcement in *Luke 2:10 "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people."* Too often we lose our joy during the most joyful of all seasons for one reason or another. Jesus came to bring joy to the individual heart regardless of all the joy robbers that come our way. As Christians at this time of the year, we too are focussed on all the commercialism that surrounds us in this age. It is true also that many times we lose the real meaning of Christmas, focus on all the materialism and as such, we lose our joy.

In our text today, Paul was aware of the struggles that the Christians in Philippi were going through, and he pointed out some things that Christians in the early church could do to restore joy to their lives. These same things apply to us today as well. Paul being aware of their feelings of inferiority and the fact that they were not materially rich, pointed them towards some Godly solutions.

He says in verse 4:

- 1. **Rejoice in the Lord**: First of all, Paul boldly states: "**Rejoice [in the Lord]** *always!* The very first thing he says is to rejoice, but not just to Rejoice Always over the good things in their life. Paul knew there were bad things happening around them as well; he knew that not all things were well with them and there were many struggles they had. Regardless of these facts he wanted them to focus on the positive things that were happening in their lives. He wanted them most of all to realise that what they had God in their lives and this was the greatest thing that was going on for them. He therefore didn't just tell them to rejoice but more importantly he said, "Rejoice in the Lord."
 - Paul's encouragement was for them to develop a consistent attitude and lifestyle of finding joy in the power of the God who loves them. In today's society, it is so easy for us to find and complain about the things that are going wrong; the things that didn't work out; the disappointments and all that we didn't achieve.
 - Rejoicing in the Lord always calls us to focus on the positives; see the disappointments as God's appointments; instead of looking at the glass half empty, see it as half full; see the things that didn't work out as part of God's purpose for us to reach higher.
 - Paul wanted them to get the point and he restated this same thought to them. "I will say it again--rejoice." He knew that he needed to get their attention off the problems at hand. He says, "I will say it again-rejoice in the Lord always." The Advent candle reminds us that JOY comes through Jesus.
- 2. Paul goes in in verse 5 to say, "Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near." Many times, we allow others to push us to our limits and cause us to lack gentility. When we lose our gentleness, we become angry, discontented, frustrated, hot tempered and Joyless. This happens partly because we forget who we are in Christ when we are perplexed by a bad neighbour or a troublesome co-worker or a hardnosed family member. We forget that its not every battle we can fight and we also forget that anger and malice are not just ungentle ways but they are opposites of the true Christian character. Lack of gentleness is a joy killer

as when we lose our gentleness we spend time with a feeling of guilt and shame about unkind things we think, do and say.

Paul also says the Lord is near to settle our disputes so we don't have to. It's up to us to show a spirit of gentleness which opens the way for joy to come into negative situations. If we maintain our gentleness we will maintain our joy in Christ and remain relatively happy even when life throws us difficult situations.

3. The third point Paul makes is very central to our happiness as Christians today. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Life these days is filled with worry and anxiety for many individuals. People are worried about their jobs, their future, changes in the world and their economic viability. Many are worried about their family members, the loss of values and attitudes that guide our lives and instilled pride and joy in our growing up. The rate of suicide is on the rise as there are many who lose their hope and can't be helped by the man made and societal structures that are set up to help us cope. According to statistics, hundreds of thousands of people have become dependent on anti depressants in order to turn up for work or just to function on a daily basis. Worry and anxiety are causing so many to go into depression and in fact these are two huge joy killers for us as God's people.

- Paul also gives us some very practical, realistic, tried, tested and proven ways to keep our joy. In everything, by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let our request be made know to God and God's peace will be with us.
- I Thess. 5:16-18 says, "Be joyful always. Give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
- Paul instructs us to redirect our thoughts, attitudes, and actions and put the things you have learned into practice. And if you do, this is a conditional promise; The God of peace will be with you. Romans 12:12 says to be *"joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.*" Christ is our joy so as he comes, our moment of rejoicing is rekindled. Amen.
