## Prayer of Reflection

Meditation:

Consider all those who were with Jesus in his final days and what all these different stations represent. Let us consider Jesus and Peter, Jesus and Judas, Jesus and his Disciples. Remember also those who a week before had rolled out the "red carpet," waved palm branches to welcome him into Jerusalem. No doubt there were many in that same crowd who cried out, "crucify him, crucify him." Let us take a moment to think of how he stood on Pilate's pavement in shame and ridicule.

As we pause to consider those figures and remember those close to Jesus in his final days, which of these figures represent us?

Are we like Peter who vowed that he would never deny him but did so in the heat of the moment?

Are we Judas who carried out the act of betrayal and sealed it with a final kiss?
Are we among the crowd who forsook him and turned him over to be crucified?
Perhaps some of us are in Pilates place and we are carrying out the final act of washing our hands clean of his blood.

Maybe we are just the silent onlookers standing in the crowd; watching in fear and cannot do a thing to help Jesus.

Were you there brothers and sisters when they mocked, sentenced and left Jesus to carry that cross to Calvary?

Today as we look back and put ourselves in the place and time where Jesus was crucified, we don't have to do it with shame, scorn and guilt. Jesus went to Calvary, died on that cruel cross so that you and I could stand in grace. As we ponder Jesus' last night with his friends and family and how alone he felt as they fell asleep while he prayed in Gethsemane, we live knowing that we are never alone because God through his grace always stand with us. Amen.
