Psalm 23 in Word

John 10: 11-15

Sermon: "God's Way, our Path to Life"

Text: Psalm 23 Theme: "God's Way, our Path to Life"

Psalm 23 falls in book 1 of the Psalms and book 1 depicts in large part David's cry for mercy as he is perused by Saul whose intent was to destroy the eminent King of Israel.

"Millions of people have memorized this psalm, even those who have learned few other Scripture portions. Ministers have used it to comfort people who are going through severe personal trials, suffering illness, or dying. For some, the words of this psalm have been the last they have ever uttered in life." (Boice)

When David writes this Psalm though, he is very old, in fact he is almost at the point of death. He is looking back over his life and he is at peace. He is reflecting on the goodness of God and the various ways in which the Lord has watched over his life.

David is please and very secure in his trust in God and writes very profoundly about how God has kept him throughout his lifetime.

In the very first verse of the Psalm David makes a very, bold and profound declaration, "The Lord is my shepherd"

The title or notion of Shepherd in the Israelite context was a very powerful on. It had a very rich and important significance to them and was not used willy nilly or in any insignificant ways. When the title of Shepherd was used, it was used to talk about a King, a Lord, or God himself.

He primary duties of the shepherd's vocation was protection and provision for the flock. The shepherd pastured the flock, led them in the right way when they had to move, fended off predators.

The sheep were the shepherd's responsibility, and he was accountable for their welfare and safety.

David in looking back at his life highlights some critical ways that God, his Shepherd has watched over his life unto the very time that he writes. This Psalm is also a testimony to us saying, "Look what the Lord has done.

It is a testimony of God's SALVIVIC Presence with his people at every phase of their lives.

It is a testimony of Gods power coming alive in the lives of his children when they really needed it and even when they least expected it.

This is David's testimony of God's infinite GOODNESS, GOD'S UNCEASING GRACE AND GOD'S FAITHFULNESS.

David say, because God has been my shepherd.

 a. I do not lack. David realised that he had no need as God cared for him throughout his time serving the Lord. During the forty years in the wilderness, Israel lacked nothing (Deuteronomy 2:7) For the Lord your God has blessed you in everything you have done. He has watched your every step through this great wilderness. During these forty years, the Lord your God has been with you, and you have lacked nothing."

He makes me lie down in green pastures.

- Succulent ideal pastures filled with good things. He leads me beside peaceful waters.
- The best water holes where we are refreshed and rejuvenated.
- The Lord takes us to the best places in life.
- Our God is a God of completion, he never leaves things undone.
- b. He restores my soul/life. There are times when circumstances cause us as to give up on life. Many times, we are battered and beaten by the tides of life but somehow we continue to survive. God restores our souls and gives us reasons to go on.
- c. He leads me in the paths of righteousness: David no doubt was reflecting on the many times he could have chosen the evil path. He could have gone against God and fought Saul like an evil man. No he committed his battles to the Lord. The Lord's way leads to righteousness. There are some fights we are going to lose if we lose our righteous selves.
- d. You are with me, your rod and staff they comfort me. This is the word of salvation addressed to those in danger. The Israelites knew this calm reassurance from God very well as God would have said to them many times, "fear not, for I am with you."
- e. You prepare a table before me in the presence of mine enemies. This is an image dependent on the feast that was part of the rituals of thanksgiving.
- f. Goodness (the benefits of blessing) and lovingkindness shall pursue me. It is of significance that DAVID who was pursued by enemies was here noting that he was pursued by God's Goodness and mercy.
- g. And I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever: The Psalm ends with the calmest assurance that he would enjoy the presence of the LORD forever both in his days on this earth and beyond.

"In the Old Testament world, to eat and drink at someone's table created a bond of mutual loyalty, and could be the culminated token of a covenant...So to be God's guest is to be more than a acquaintance, invited for a day. It is to live with Him." (Kidner)

ii. "While I am here I will be a child at home with my God; the whole world shall be his house to me; and when I ascend into the upper chamber I shall not

change my company, nor even change the house; I shall only go to dwell in the upper storey of the house of the Lord for ever." (Spurgeon)
