Minister's Message

"The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus 2 it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing.

The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.

They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God". Isaiah 35:1-2

With the blanket of snow and winter winds upon us we wouldn't think that the image of a rejoicing and blossoming wilderness would help us to think of the Advent season. But the 35th chapter of Isaiah has been claimed as a text of Advent for many years. It was originally written for a people living in exile, apart from their homeland and everything with which they were familiar. They were in a time of long and difficult waiting for God's promises to come true.

Hearing a prophecy like this helped them to hope that the Messiah would bring change, like life overflowing to their dry and desperate situation. So we read this passage at this time of year and think about the promise of Christ's coming to us again as the calendar year ends, as the world continues to be filled with darkness. Christ brings life overflowing in the restoration of relationships (with the land, with God, with each other), and in the beauty of hoping in the midst of despair. It may seem unrealistic, as it seemed to the Hebrew people. But God promises that we too will see the glory of the Lord, that we will walk in the holy way...whatever that may look like today. The task, especially in Advent, is to wait and prepare by keeping that vision of God's will for the world right in our sights, within our grasp. This vision will help us to blossom in the cold and share Christ's light in the darkness...

What's going on with the wider church?

The 2015 General Assembly received several overtures regarding the full inclusion of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgendered (LGBT) people. Some of these overtures (an overture is like a motion at a meeting requesting action to be taken) were in favour of full inclusion while some were not. The outcome at General Assembly was for the Church Doctrine and Justice committees to study the issue further and report back to the next assembly. Part of this study involves consulting with Presbyteries and congregations through a discussion document. The current stance of the Presbyterian Church in Canada is that it is acceptable to be LGBT but not to act on that sexuality. The belief is that the sexual orientation is not a sin itself (i.e. people don't choose to be gay), but the act of having sex with someone of the same sex is. Currently the church does not allow for same sex marriage nor does it ordain people who are openly in a same sex relationship. Some of the overtures are requesting th is stance be changed to fully include all people into all aspects of the church. The session hopes to have an open discussion about this difficult subject with those interested in the near future. In the meantime, you are free to speak to Heather about it and are encouraged to pray for a just and loving resolution.
