Announcement from NC-St. A's Session:

We regret to inform the congregation of NC-St.A's that at Knox's annual meeting on Sunday March 3rd the Knox congregation voted to begin the process of closing the church. Please note, this is all that was decided at that time. The Session of NC-St. A's will discuss this decision at our next meeting on March 18th.

We acknowledge that this decision greatly impacts NC-St.A's ministry and that of our minister and respect that Knox did not take this decision lightly. This process will not begin for a few months due to Presbytery procedure and the full weight of this decision will not be felt by either congregation for up to a year or more. We ask that our congregation greet this news with compassion and patience as both we and Knox maneuver through the process ahead. Prayer support for the leadership of Knox, NC-St. A's, Rev. Shelly and Presbytery would be appreciated at this time and during this transition.
