### **April 7: World Health Day (April 7)**

Good health starts with good nutrition—especially for young children. In a poor village in Haiti, one-year-old Marcellus was losing weight rapidly and had a persistent cough. Because of crop losses, his single mother was struggling to feed the little boy and his five siblings. She knew Marcellus needed medical attention, but the price of transport to the closest health facility was more than she could afford.

Hope came to Marcellus's mother in the form of a mobile clinic supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development and other Canadian Foodgrains Bank members. There, Marcellus received a nutrient-rich food supplement called Nourimanba, antibiotics and multivitamins.

Marcellus is no longer malnourished and is on course to grow up healthy and strong.

### **Responding to the Cyclone Idai:**

Over 2.6 million people across Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe are in need of humanitarian aid due to flooding from Cyclone Idai.

Roads, schools, houses and crops have been severely damaged. Access to electricity and safe water is limited.

PWS&D is raising funds to support relief efforts as part of the Humanitarian Coalition Cyclone Idai appeal, in collaboration with Canadian Foodgrains Bank—a member of the Humanitarian Coalition. ### **A Time of Transition:**

The bullet list below are steps in the process of Transition taken thus far. Throughout this time of Transition a process list will be provided every Sunday and updated on a regular basis. If you have any questions, concerns or comments Rev. Shelly and Knox or NC-St. A's elders will do their best to address them.

Transition Steps taken so far and those approaching:

- Knox voted to begin the process COMPLETED MARCH 3, 2019
- NC-St. A's informed of decision COMPLETED MARCH 10, 2019
- Knox informed Presbytery of decision COMPLETED MARCH 18, 2019
- Presbytery will grant Knox permission to begin process APRIL 9, '19
- Knox Session meets with Presbytery Committee
- NC-St. A's Session meets with Presbytery Committee
- Knox Congregational meeting May 26, 2019 (decisions: date of process completion & dissolution or amalgamation?)
