The church uses a different calendar; it's called a liturgical or a Christian calendar. It has more than just four seasons and the first season in the church calendar is right around the corner. Are you ready?



Seasons of the Liturgical Calendar

Advent

When it starts: 4 Sundays before Christmas

When it ends: Christmas Eve

Theme: Anticipating the birth of the Messiah

Christmas

When it starts: December 25

When it ends: Twelve days later (Jan 6) Theme: Celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ

Epiphany

When it starts: Jan 6

When it ends: The day before Lent Theme: Jesus reveals Himself as God

<u>Lent</u>

When it starts: Ash Wednesday When it ends: The day before Easter Theme: A time of renewal with Jesus

Easter

When it starts: Easter Day When it ends: Pentecost

Theme: Celebrating the resurrection of Christ

<u>Pentecost</u>

When it starts: 50th day after Easter (Pentecost means 50th day)

When it ends: The day before Advent


Theme: Celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit

Pancake Suppers

Many Christians over the years have developed traditions to help mark the change in the Christian season. For example, some have Pancake Suppers on the Tuesday right before Ash Wednesday (also called Shrove Tuesday) to prepare themselves for the Lenten season which traditionally involves fasting (going without meat!).

Activity

Ask an adult to help you mark all of the Christian seasons on your calendar; when they start and when they end. Plan a special activity or celebration for you and your family to do together to mark each change in season. If you come up with a really good idea; invite people from your church to do it with you!
