At exactly 9:25 pm., August 4, 1914, Newfoundland Time, Governor Davidson received a telegram at Government House, St. John's, advising him that Great Britain had declared war on Germany, and that therefore Newfoundland was war. Thousands of men and women answered Davidson's call to serve overseas and at home. Over a thousand were killed and many more wounded in a disproportioned sacrifice for peace.

On Monday evening, August 4, 2014, the Basilica of St. John the Baptist and St. Bonaventure's College will host an ecumenical service of remembrance to mark the exact moment when Governor Davidson received the telegram. All members of the community are invited to remember in prayer, song, poetry, and story the leaders, adults, youth and families who gave of themselves so generously. In doing so, we commit ourselves to new efforts aimed at ensuring that all will see and experience peace in our time.
