A note from the Hymn Committee.

Between 9 and 12 August 1941, Prime Minister Winston Churchill of the U. K. and President Franklin D Roosevelt met aboard the USS Augusta in Placentia Bay, Newfoundland. From this historic meeting was issued a joint declaration which became known as the Atlantic Charter. It was instrumental in the formation of the United Nations. Prior to the meetings, Prime Minister Churchill invited President Roosevelt to a church service on board the HMS Prince of Wales. He chose the hymns himself. Although he later described his relationship to the Church as like a flying buttress, that is, supporting the Church from the outside, it is clear that he knew a good hymn when he heard one. Three of our hymns for this coming Sunday, Nos: 325, 330 and 487 were the three sung at this service. Our fourth hymn, No: 633 was selected by Sir Winston Churchill for his own funeral. Each hymn speaks of courage and reliance upon God.

This theme was suggested by one of the congregation. We welcome any feedback or other suggestions. Please contact us via the Church office.

Once again this year **Bridges To Hope** will be partnering with Community Centers and Corporate Sponsors to provide the children of our province the chance to enroll in our Bag to School Program. Last year we were able to fill over 991 bags for children across the province; of which 662 were packed by the staff and volunteer of Bridges To Hope for children in the Metro area.

To once again offer this program we will be reaching out to our partner Churches in the hopes that each congregation will be able to sponsor a specific school item. St. Andrew's has been asked to collect crayons and colouring leads which can be dropped off at the church office or at Bridges To Hope.

This will go a long way towards ensuring another successful school year

for the children of our city and province. While we aim for each congregation to raise the item assigned to it; all donations of school supplies will be used.

Some of the other items we are looking for are: Pencils / Pencil Cases; Binders (1 or 2 inch); Calculators (basic model); Exercise Books (4 pack); Exercise Books (coil); Geometry Sets; Rulers / Erasers and Duo tangs.
