Leading Human Rights Lawyer, Jonathan Kuttab, speaks at the **The Lantern - A Christian Life Centre -Thursday, September 27, 7:00pm - 9:00 pm.** Sponsored by Canadians, Arabs and Jews for a Just Peace, Independent Jewish Voices Canada, United Network for Justice and Peace in Palestine and Israel, KAIROS Halifax, and The St. John's Group for Human Rights in Palestine. Jonathan is a Palestinian Christian, resident of East Jerusalem, past chair of the Bethlehem Bible College, and serves on the board of the Sabeel Ecumenical Theology Centre, Jerusalem.

Rainbow Communion is a special committee of the General Assembly that has been empowered to invite LGBTQI persons to tell stories of harm done to them within and by the church, and to share their stories of God's grace experienced by them in Christian ministry. 
