'Ours' was composed by Juno-nominated Canadian composer John Estacio with a libretto by Newfoundland Governor General award-winning playwright Robert Chafe. Directed by Glynis Levshon and conducted by Judith Yan, the all-star cast includes Andrew Love as Thomas Nagle, Gordon Geitz as Archbishop Roche, and Lara Ciekiewicz as May.
