#### Bridges to Hope Financial Commitment.

One of St. Andrew's outreach missions is Bridges to Hope, an organization dedicated to providing food aid assistance to those in need. These individuals may be our co-workers, neighbours or friends. We have made an annual financial commitment of \$3.600. However, to the end of November only \$1,500 has been given towards this cause. Please remember those less fortunate at this time.

**Operational givings to November 30th**...At our Annual Meeting last year, we budgeted for operational givings of \$198,500. To the end of November 2018 actual givings were \$137,978. To the end of November 2017 givings were \$156,443, and in addition we had received \$20,000 from Estates, thus we are down \$38,465 over the prior year. This makes it challenging to meet our operational expenses.
