The New Year Covenanting Service

Confession of Faith: (Together) God has come to us. The Lord spoke to the people of Israel and entered into covenant with them. From Israel came Jesus Christ, the Son of God, bringing salvation through a new covenant entered by faith. The Lord continues to come to us by the Holy Spirit, God present in the world, and Guide to the church, the new Israel. (from: *Living Faith*)

The traditional Wesley Covenanting Invitation:

Minister: Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants. Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him. Christ has many services to be done. Some are more easy and honourable, others are more difficult and disgraceful. Some are suitable to our inclinations and interests, others are contrary to both.

In some we may please Christ and please ourselves. But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves. It is necessary, therefore that we consider what it means to be a servant of Christ. Let us, therefore, go to Christ, and pray:

Congregation:

Let me be your servant, under your command. I will no longer be my own. I will give up myself to your will in all things. Be satisfied that Christ shall give you your place and work.

Lord, make me what you will.

I put myself fully into your hands:
put me to doing, put me to suffering,
let me be employed for you, or laid aside for you,
let me be full, let me be empty,
let me have all things, let me have nothing.

I freely and with a willing heart give it all to your pleasure and disposal.

Minister: It was the tradition on Covenanting Sunday to direct the gathered congregation to not only consider the new beginning God in Christ was calling them to but to them commit such to writing. Listen to the traditional words:

You are advised to make this covenant not only in your heart, but in word; not only in word, but in writing. Therefore, with all reverence, lay the service before the Lord as your act and deed. And when you have done this, sign it. Then keep it as a reminder of the holy agreement between God and you that you may remember it during doubts and temptations.

Minutes for Mission CANADA: Presbytery of Winnipeg

Our gifts to *Presbyterians Sharing* support new ministries across Canada, including Trinity Presbyterian Church in Winnipeg. So the congregation has moved to a small church near the University of Manitoba until their new building is completed.
