Despite the tragedies the people of Haiti faced in 2010—a massive earthquake, Hurricane Tomas and an outbreak of cholera—hope abounds as families rebuild their homes and lives. Since the earthquake on Jan 12, 2010, churches and individuals raised over \$1.5 million, which PWS&D has already disbursed to the ACT Alliance to provide transitional houses, food, clean water, health care, seeds, tools, schools, income generating initiatives, psychosocial and art therapy programs, and support for communities affected by cholera.
