Our gifts to *Presbyterians Sharing* support Denise Van Wissen, a nutritionist who helps educate women's groups on how to improve health in their communities. One of the topics Denise emphasizes is the importance of an adequate weaning diet, as many babies stop growing adequately after about six months of age. She teaches the importance of introducing beans and meat earlier, the benefits of lots of vegetables and fruits, and the importance of not purchasing pre-prepared "jello" for babies. Currently on maternity leave from her work with Fraternidad de Presbiteriales Mayas (FPM) in Guatemala, Denise is getting to practice what she preaches. Let us pray for Denise, the Fraternidad, and women's groups in Guatemala as they work together to better their family's lives.
