Carrot Cake - Ella McWilliam

2 cups flour

- 2 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 3 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup oil

4 eggs

2 cups carrots, grated raw

1 cup raisins

Mix together, put in greased 9"x13" pan Cook 350 degrees F for 35 minutes

Mix together 1 cup of each: grated carrots, grated potatoes, suet, raisins, brown sugar, flour. Add 1 teaspoon soda, shake of salt, candied fruit.

SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

The Sunday School teachers have had a very busy spring, summer and fall. We have hosted 13 Moms and Tots days and are planning to finish off the year with 3 days. They have been held the 2nd and the 4th Friday of each month. The day consists of a welcome song, story time with topics that change each day (2 stories), a sing-a-long with activities and a closing goodbye song. Children then visit a craft and coloring station that match the theme of the day. Don't forget time to play while mom's and grandma's relax, with a coffee or cold drink and get caught up on local news. We have enjoyed this time and hope to carry on into the new year. Each day is a different theme and we have had as few as 3, but also as many as 12 children. We have had all preschoolers, except in the summer when it was opened to all ages. This time has opened our church to the community and encouraged young moms to come out and meet others with kids their own age. We consider it a success.

We also hosted a free family BBQ in June. We had around 54 that attended from the community, and offered hamburgs, hot dogs, fries, drinks and ice cream. On Halloween night we handed out 17 treat bags with a total of 20 kids attending (3 had received their bags in the mailbox earlier, but wanted to show their appreciation for this).

We are planning a family Christmas service on Sunday, December 4 at 11. It will have lots of music, a skit and time for everyone to get their wiggles out. We hope you will come. Oh and yes it will be followed by a potluck lunch! Yum!



LADIES AID HAPPENINGS

After 2 years of inactivity, the Ladies Aid group is back in action with regular meetings and activities. In August, we hosted a community potluck dinner. Nothing beats a good Presbyterian potluck! We had a very successful pulled pork drive through dinner on September 9 serving just over 160 meals. FROM THE PULPIT... The way of Peace Luke 1:68-79

Even before the angels shouted from the heavens, "Peace on earth, goodwill among people"

We are told in the Gospel of Luke about how Zechariah was given a 'time-out' as it were, to rediscover the way of peace.

About 450 years before Zechariah the prophet Micah wrote: "Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty.

Sure enough, suddenly there is an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense in the temple where Zechariah is performing his priestly duties while the whole assembly of God's people waited patiently outside praying.

But 450 years is a long time and life gets busy and one can lose their focus. Instead of experiencing peace and joy about the message Zechariah was terrified! Fear gripped him ... and the angel said, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John. ¹⁴ You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, ¹⁵ for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. ... he will be filled with the Holy Spirit. ¹⁶ He will turn many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. ... to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." (Luke 1: 13-17)

And Zechariah's response is, "How can? Oh-oh... wrong answer. The angel is offended and says, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. ²⁰ But now, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time, you will become mute, unable to speak, until the day these things occur." (You want a sign Zechariah? Ok. You are the voice of God to the people, but you doubt what the LORD says through His messenger, so you will lose your voice until you believe when you see things happen.)

Luke tells us that both Zachariah and his wife Elizabeth "were righteous before God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord. Zechariah was following the rules but it seems he has stopped waiting expectantly for God to break in and do what only God can do. In his head he knows the promises of God to redeem his people, but he needs to know in his heart too. Maybe Zechariah should have known better because as a priest he should always make room for the unexpected – for the LORD to break in – but he asked the question and made clear his suspended belief, "How will I know that this is so? For I am an old man, and my wife is getting on in years."

Zechariah has more than 9 months to watch and listen and learn in his quiet time with the LORD. He learned a deeper meaning of shalom. The Hebrew word for peace is shalom. Shalom has a much deeper meaning than, just lack of war or conflict. It means wholeness or completeness. Zachariah knew this definition, but he needed to learn God's plans for shalom includes not only his peace, but peace for everyone; he needed to remember God has a plan and it is good. At the end of that time Zechariah ... ⁶³ asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And all of them were amazed. ⁶⁴ Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, **praising God**. That's the response that was wanted to Gabriel's message!!!

As we remember the messages of peace and joy the messengers of God brought to Zechariah, to Mary, and to the shepherds, let us take time to listen for God's words, and let us take time to Praise the Lord, to enjoy the peace of the LORD that passes all understanding, the peace that broke *into* this world – the peace of Christ.

"Do not be afraid; for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people" the angel said to the shepherds.

The scripture reading is called the Benedictus: it is the song of thanksgiving uttered by Zechariah with the birth of his son, John. The first part of the hymn or song is thanksgiving to God for promises kept to restore Israel, to send a Saviour. The second part of the hymn is an address by Zechariah to his own son, who was to take so important a part in God's plan of the Redemption; for he was to be a prophet, and to preach the forgiveness of sins.
