FROM THE PULPIT....

At Easter ...

It is Jesus who steps across the wide gulf of shame that opened between him and his disciples, and it is Jesus who begins again on the old friendly trustful terms, and draws nearer still to them. He has paid the price – it is the breaking in of heaven on earth – Jesus -

Jesus is infinitely patient in bringing each of his close friends and disciples into the light – into believing in him. Jesus is infinitely patient in bringing us out of the darkness and into the light too. And when we are in the light, we are to be infinitely patient with others that Jesus is bringing into the light.

"He is not simply a model for life," the theologian Barclay writes, "he is a living presence to help us live." He is not merely a hero of the past; he is a living reality of the present".

The resurrection is the central event of the Bible – it is the foundation of our faith. Without this reversal of the shamefulness of the cross Jesus' death would have atoned for nothing. The resurrection shows us Jesus is who he said he is and his word is true.

Scripture does not give an eye-witness account of the moment when Jesus burst forth from the grave on that first Easter morning - no person saw Jesus exit the tomb,.... but many saw the risen Christ Jesus. When the stone was rolled away and the tomb is empty of Jesus, we got our first glimpse of a new world. It is a world where death doesn't have the last word, where injustice and innocent suffering is made right, by the intrusion of a powerful God.

We cannot make people believe - we can tell the resurrection story as the Scriptures teach us, the rest is God's work, now as it was then - heaven breaking in –

It is a faith story, ... believe it! Jesus has risen!
