Remembering through song

Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. [a] 5 You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. 6 Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. 7 Recite them to your

children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise.

Deuteronomy 6: 4—7

Long, long ago God's people committed to memory the works of God in creation, in redemption, in life giving Laws.; the things that demonstrated how much God loves them. I remember having to learn memory work every week in grade school. We had to recite it at the beginning of the week in front of the class, and we were graded on our memory work. I don't think that is given the same importance in this century. But remembering God's faithfulness and loving kindness remains important.

I always knew music had the ability to lift a person's spirits, to draw one out of misery or just out of a place they didn't want to be, to energize and to give hope. Just over a decade ago when I was in school, my Hebrew professor told us that if we put our lessons to music, it would make remembering it much easier – I believe him. I witnessed in a long-term care residence how hymns and songs of praise were the stimulus that miraculously animated Alzheimer patients – they remembered the words and the melody being sung! Music is a gift!

I am sharing some of my favourite songs of praise and hymns in the computer links listed below (if you are getting this newsletter by email you can just click on the link to hear them), and I invite you to have a listen to them or, if you prefer, get out your hymnbook and look up your own favourites like Amazing Grace, Jesus Loves me, Joy to the World, What a Friend we have in Jesus, or Holy, holy.

I start by listening, and as I continue to listen to favourite hymns or songs of praise, I find myself singing along, and then as I play them again and again, not only does it give me energy, I also learn them by heart. The beauty of having them committed to memory is that when I need to remember most how deep and wide and high the love of God is, they seem to be right there in my mind, and I find myself singing. I hope you do too. There are lots to choose from – Enjoy!

March Recipe – Crockpot Lasagne for a 6 qt. Crockpot

- 3-4 lbs. ground beef
- 1 large onion (yellow or Spanish)
- 2 pkg. Oven Ready Lasagna Noodles
- 2 jars Rao's tomato sauce
- 2-500 ml cottage cheese (2 containers)
- 2-3 large eggs

Balderson Cheddar Cheese – 3 cups or to your desire or Asiago cheese to add sharp cheese taste. (No salt added in recipe)

Black pepper

Cook up ground beef, add chopped onions in halfway. Can add Italian seasoning if desired. Once fully cooked, add Rao's tomato sauce jars into meat. Simmer for an hour to reduce acidity (optional).

While meat and sauce are simmering, in a big bowl add cottage cheese, black pepper, and eggs. Mix well.

Once sauce/meat is done, put a thin layer of meat sauce in the bottom of crockpot. Then layer first noodles (I have to break some to fit. It's okay to overlap a little. Then layer some shredded cheese and then meat sauce. Then noodles. Add in the cottage cheese mixture, shredded cheese on top of the noodles. Then meat sauce then noodles. Cheese, noodles, cottage cheese, noodles...keep going. Cook on low 4-6 hours.

Challenges Persist in Afghanistan

Afghanistan, Impact Stories

In the Kushkak village in Afghanistan, 42-year-old Guljan lived a simple life with her husband and their four children, including her daughter-in-law. In recent years, her husband grappled with debilitating leg pain, rendering him unable to work and placing the burden of financial support on Guljan and her sons. Despite facing economic hardships and managing household responsibilities, Guljan displayed unwavering determination to provide for her family.

On what seemed to be a typical day in October 2023, Guljan was away from home, seeking medical attention for her six-year-old daughter when she heard news about an earthquake striking her home district. Hurrying back to her village, she encountered a sight of complete devastation. The once familiar landscape was transformed into debris.

Heartbreakingly, the earthquake had claimed the lives of her husband and 11-year-old son, both trapped inside the house during the disaster.

Post-Earthquake Challenges

After her husband's passing, Guljan assumed the role of decision-maker for her family, taking on responsibilities that were once his. Now a female-headed household, she encountered significant challenges in obtaining assistance. Observing the disparity in opportunities, she noted that restrictions placed on women exacerbated their difficulties in participating in assessments compared to their male counterparts in the community.

However, after being identified by PWS&D's local partner as a potential project participant, Guljan's family received a winterized tent to help endure the harsh weather conditions. "In a timely intervention, [the partner] came to our aid, providing my family with a new tent, which we promptly set up," she shares.

Still, Guljan has voiced a growing concern about her family's lack of security and privacy under the tents. The communal living arrangement presented obstacles for the women in particular. Carrying out daily washings became a difficult task due to the lack of privacy caused by the cramped conditions of the tents, exposing their activities to onlookers. Likewise, the shared nature of the makeshift bathroom facilities intensified the discomfort.

As winter approached, Guljan's anxiety only increased. The village where they were temporarily settled was in the middle of a treeless desert landscape, prone to fierce, relentless winds. Two intense dust storms after the earthquake reinforced the difficult weather conditions the family faces. Additionally, with a new grandchild on the way, Guljan is concerned about how the baby, and the rest of the family, will be able to find shelter and food to survive.

Ongoing Food Security Concerns

An estimated 28.3 million Afghans (two-thirds of the population) need humanitarian assistance. The crisis is being driven by three consecutive years of drought-like conditions, crippling economic decline since the Taliban takeover in 2021, and decades of conflict and recurrent natural disasters.

As a result, Afghanistan is among the countries facing the highest levels of food insecurity in the world. According to the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, 15.8 million people are project to be food insecure in 2024.

Since the passing of <u>Bill C-41</u>, which provides exemptions for humanitarian focused aid spending in Afghanistan, PWS&D is implementing a \$1 million food assistance project in Bamiyan province, assisting 4,550 of the most marginalized households. Families will receive monthly cash assistance over a three-month period, enabling them to buy essential food items.

Your support is vital to ensure that emergency assistance and essential resources reach families like Guljan's after devasting disasters and ongoing food insecurity. PWS&D hopes to expand our response in Afghanistan – your prayers and financial gifts will make a real difference in people's lives.
