We will take the summer off from formal Sunday School and start back up again in September. However, if children come to church during the summer, we will invite them to come down to the Sunday School room for a time together.







May marked our 2nd anniversary of the Largie Playgroup. We have as many as 7 children the second and fourth Friday of each month. They formed air dry clay into a golf sized ball, flattened it into a circle, put some soil on it and then sprinkled a few flower seeds over the soil. Next they folded the edges together to form a ball. The children then took the balls (bombs) home and after allowing them to dry for 2-3 days, placed them in an area of their choice to grow. The rain will dissolve the clay and wild flowers will grow! What a great idea!

On May 26, our topic was planting your garden. We read a story and helped find the matching butterflies and counted the items on the page.

Our summer schedule will have us meet only on July 12 and August 9. This will give everyone a chance to take holidays, sign up for swimming lessons, or just have fun at home. We will go back to our regular schedule beginning September 13 and 27.

That is who Luke addresses when he wrote his gospel. It means God lovers. So, Dear God lovers,

Here we are on the threshold of summer. This is the last Newsletter until September 1st, and I'm sure you'll miss having it to read because it is so well put

together and it keeps us informed about our church community - thank you Barb!

If you are looking for something to fill in your reading time this summer and would like some ideas these are a few books that I really enjoyed.

<u>Blue Like Jazz by Donald Miller</u>: After reading this several years ago (I was in my 40's) I bought a number of copies to give to friends and family in their 20's and 30's, because as John Ortberg wrote, Miller writes about God from a position of commitment, but still sounds human and honest.

John Ortberg is a Presbyterian Minister in the USA. His writing is entertaining, easy to read, thought provoking and faith building. I have read most of his books (I think) and used many in book studies with small groups. Adults of all ages have enjoyed them. Here are some of the titles:

God is Closer than you think

If you want to walk on water, you've got to get out of the boat

Everybody's normal til you get to know them

The me I want to be

The life you've always wanted

When the game is over it all goes back in the box

Then there is **C.S. Lewis**; for children, I recommend the **Chronicles of Narnia** series. There are seven books in this series. I read them myself, to my children, and to my neighbour when she lost her eyesight. This is the order:

The Magician's Nephew

The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe

The Horse and His Boy

Prince Caspian

The Voyage of the Dawn Treader

The Silver Chair

The Last Battle

There are many books for adults by C.S. Lewis, but here are a few recommendations:

The Screwtape Letters

The Great Divorce

Mere Christianity

If you have already read the ones suggested above you might look for some books by **Max Lucado** or **Philip Yancey**. And one of my favourite authors **Barbara Brown Taylor**, wrote **Leaving Church** and **An Altar in the World** among many others.

There are lots more I would recommend, so feel free to ask if you have a specific area of interest.

Good morning. At our session meeting on Monday, session thought we should give a brief report on updates and discussion at the meeting. Rev Jim Patterson advised us that his term as Interim moderator concludes in September. His replacement has not yet been named. Mavis Currie Knox St Thomas and Keith McKee St Georges in London have both announced their retirement making 10 vacant churches in **Presbytery.** This led to discussion on the outlook of ministry across the presbytery and possibly in Largie as we continue to face the changes and challenges in rural ministry and society. There have been seminars and speakers that talked around economic changes, change in demographics, global warming and they spoke about the affect it will or could have on Churches big and small. Ranging from amalgamations, closures, part time ministry and what different modeling could be done or what the different congregations are hoping or expecting from the church today. We are currently blessed with a strong congregation. With that in mind Largie session members thought that when they do their pastoral session visits it would be a time for individuals to discuss their thoughts, concerns and vision for Largie as well as the greater church. Even though session consists of 6 members of the congregation there are likely more ideas than our own and we would appreciate your feed back.

APPLESAUCE COOKIES

Submitted by Isabel Reid

- 1 ³⁄₄ c. flour
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 c. shortening
- 1 c. sugar *** (left out from last month)
- 1 egg
- 1 c. applesauce
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 c. rolled oats (prefer large rolled oats)
- 1/2 tsp. cloves
- 1 c. raisins



Combine flour, salt and spices. Cream sugar, shortening and egg thoroughly. Combine applesauce and soda. Add to cream mixture alternating with dry ingredients. Stir in oats and raisins. Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 15 to 20 minutes.

Strawberry Glace Pie

9-inch baked pie shell

6 c. strawberries (about 1 ¹/₂ quarts)

1 c. sugar

3 tbsp. cornstarch

1/2 c. water

1 package (3 ounces) cream cheese, softened



Bake pie shell. Mash enough strawberries to measure 1 cup. Mix sugar and cornstarch in 2-quart saucepan. Stir in water and mashed strawberries gradually. Cook over medium heat stirring constantly, until mixture thickens and boils. Boil and stir 1 minute; cool.

Beat cream cheese until smooth, spread on bottom of pie shell. Fill shell with whole strawberries; pour cooked strawberry mixture over top. Refrigerate until set, at least 3 hours.

Peach Glace Pie: substitute 5 cups sliced peaches (7 medium) for the strawberries. To prevent discoloration, use an ascorbic acid mixture as directed on package.

Raspberry Glace Pie: substitute raspberries for the strawberries
