
We will take the summer off from formal Sunday School and start back up again in September. However, if children come


FROM THE BOARD OF MANAGERS

Thoughts On Approaching Summer

I am thankful for the freedom and the good weather that allows me to sit outside looking at gardens, watching small animals and birds, hearing the singing and chirping, and the windchimes. Even the traffic sounds almost like waves hitting the shore if it

all moves smoothly. In the relative quiet of the afternoon I find it is so much easier to think good thoughts and speak encouraging words.

On such a lovely day it is so much easier to remember all of the good things we look forward to as spring is turning into summer.

What crosses your mind? Is it a wedding, or the birth of a child/grandchild, maybe it will be your birthday, or anniversary, or a reunion of some kind, or Father's Day? Maybe you are excited about planting season or new work ventures, or holidays away, or having the children home for summer (I'm sure the children are excited about summer holidays.)

For all of these, I will pray, give thanks, and ask for blessings. God is good!

But sometimes it is not so easy to feel thankful, joyful, or hopeful and we need help. So it's good to be reminded that this coming month we also celebrate Pentecost – the coming of the Holy Spirit. This is the Spirit that helps us pray even when things are not what we hoped for. The apostle Paul knew that.

In his letter to the Philippians, Paul first lets them know, "I thank my God every time I remember you constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ... for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel. ... And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, ...". (Philippians chapter 1)

How wonderful that he could pray like that. He wasn't enjoying the gardens. He was sitting in chains. And as I was hearing about news that was just sad this past week, locally (the tragic death of four students and one teacher on their way home from a game) and globally (raging fires, floods, and the tragic abuse of power), I was thinking, what a gift it is to be able to pray in all circumstances.

So let us pray for those who celebrate and for those who mourn. Let us rejoice in the blessings we receive, in the good times we are given, and turn to strengthen those in need or despair. For we have the strength to be the hands and feet and heart of Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Oatmeal Cookies

2 c. raisins

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. hot water

Put in a glass measuring cup in the microwave and cook until raisins are tender and plump. Do not drain.

1 c. brown sugar

3 ½ c. flour

1 c. sugar

½ tsp. salt

1 c. shortening

1 tsp. baking powder

4 eggs beaten

1/2 tsp. cloves

1 tsp. vanilla

½ tsp. cinnamon

4 c. quick oatmeal



Cream sugar, shortening, eggs, and vanilla; mix well. Sift flour, salt, baking powder, cinnamon and cloves together. Add flour mixture oatmeal and raisins to creamed mixture. Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for approximately 10-12 minutes or until cookies are firm.

This was Becky's Dad's favourite. Her Great Aunt would make them when her Dad stopped in Nebraska to visit family. It's been passed through the generations.
