Minister's Report - 2019

Dear Friends in Christ,

Once again it is time to welcome a new year. As we look back on the previous year, we have a lot to be thankful for and a great deal to meditate and reflect upon as well.

At one time or another we might have heard a comment or a remark by someone along the lines of: "Why do things have to change, why can't everything remain the same as it always has been?" Sometimes this notion can be very nice to think about, but we must not become too hung up or focused on nostalgia. - Feb 17 Rev. Morley Shaw's last Sunday with us. Myla Borden and several drumming students participated in the service in honour of Black History Month. After church, a social time was held to thank Rev. Shaw & Joy for their time with us.
- Feb. 24-Sacrament of Holy Communion with Rev. Lorne MacLeod leading the service. The St. James Brass
Quintet provided some spiritual music in recognition of Black History Month.
- March 2 Induction of Rev. Andrew MacDonald as the new minister for First Presbyterian Church.
- March 3 Rev. MacDonald's first service as we welcomed him and his wife and two daughters to the church.
- April 18 Joint Maundy Thursday service held with St. Andrew's congregation in the Upper Hall.
- April 19 Joint Good Friday service held with St. Andrew's.
- April 21Sunrise Service held at 8 am in Laurie Park beside the Fire Station. Organist Lloyd played his accordion
to accompany the hymns. Coffee and muffins were served in the Upper Hall after.
Regular service held at 11:00 am with the jubilant sound of the trumpet.
- April 28 Mission Awareness Sunday with members of the AMS groups in attendance.
- May 4 Cantata held here with choirs from here, St. Andrew's and Green Hill-Alma United. Proceeds went to Canadian Foodgrains Bank to support an end to global hunger.
- June 16 There was a congregational sing-a-long before the service led by Brent MacQuarrie, Justin Savage and Keith MacDonald. The joint congregation picnic was held at Camp Geddie in the afternoon with a good attendance.
- June 23 The Sunday School closing was held at the end of the service with a short presentation.

The Kirk Session of First Presbyterian Church 2019 Annual Report to the Congregation

The Kirk Session of First Presbyterian Church NG

2019. A New Year... and still no Called Minister to First! We were SO close to completing the process by the end of 2018! CLOSE! ...but not quite there! However, God willing, this would be the year! We were blessed to have Rev. Morley Shaw continue with pulpit supply and Rev. Lorne MacLeod as Interim Moderator of Session. The paperwork prepared for the Call had yet to be reviewed by the Business Committee of Presbytery before it could be formally presented to Presbytery by their January 15th meeting date. Representative Elders, Gary Ross and Teela Billington; and Elder, Larry Ingham, were given a time on Presbytery's agenda in order to speak on behalf of the Congregation, in favour of our Call to Rev. Andrew MacDonald.

The "process" seemed SO slow, and felt like things took forever to get done, but Presbytery accepted our Call to Rev. MacDonald! The Induction Service was scheduled for Saturday afternoon, March 2, 2019! It was OFFICIAL! Rev. MacDonald preached his first sermon as our new Minister the very next day, Sunday, March 3, 2019! Our first Session meeting moderated by Rev. MacDonald, was held on March 5th! Nothing like jumping in with both feet right away!! We were ecstatic! The completion of many years' work at last! However, this also marked the end of pulpit supply with Rev. Shaw and the "official" support Session and the congregation received from Morley and Interim Moderator, Rev. Lorne MacLeod. A great debt of THANKS goes to these two wonderful individuals. We couldn't have done it without them!! We held an emotional farewell following Rev. Shaw's last worship sermon, February, 17. However, we were given a "silver lining" when Rev. Shaw indicated he would like First to be his "home" church and worship with us whenever he was not obligated nor providing supply elsewhere. What a gift to have Morley and his wife, Joy, a part of our church family! Also "officially" added to our family roll were Michael Fraser, by Profession of Faith and his wife, Linda Fraser, by Transfer of Membership from Trinity United, NG. Always a Blessing, the Baptism of Brier Glory Violet Wright, infant daughter of Justin and Melissa Wright.

Session met regularly the first Thursday of each month, with November being the only exception. Holy Communion was celebrated six times. The first in the New Year, Feb. 24th, but the last one celebrated with Rev. Lorne MacLeod. Special Easter services were held with Rev. Andrew officiating. 22 attended a new to us 0830 Sunrise Service and an Open-Air Communion service held on the property of the Log Church in Loch Broom; which coincided with our 233rd Anniversary Service celebrations, were initiated by Rev. Andrew. The Open-Air Service had 20 souls brave the sunny but windy and cool, September afternoon in Loch Broom! He hopes to make these two services a yearly tradition.

The congregation of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, NG, was our invited guests for our Anniversary service. This was our largest attended Communion service of the year with 112 seated at the Lord's table! All Communion services were well attended, ranging from 70-112 people.

There were MANY special events, services and commemorations in 2019! You will find most of them listed in the "Year in Review" section.

We are blessed to share a wonderful association with St Andrew's Church, NG., holding many joint events and sharing summer services. The organ duo and school choir concerts held in the Sanctuary were outstanding! ... as was the Sean Dayton "Music for the Soul" concert in the upper hall. Much, much effort and planning by the Worship and Music Team and the support of the Hospitality Team and the congregation was involved with these concerts! Thank you to Janice Alcorn for filling our Sanctuary with such fabulous musical talent and the

thrill of hearing the beautiful music and angelic voices of so many young people! Thank you to Session for taking a bit of a risk and lending your support of these events! Music is such a universal language and can touch a soul like nothing else! ... even without words! As fund-raisers, with the exception of the organ concert, they weren't great! BUT ... that wasn't the motivating factor! It was the worship and music team's intention to try to bring people into the church that perhaps were not "church goers" per say! Expose them to the beautiful sanctuary we have, great" First" hospitality and fellowship. In this regard they were all most successful!

Two congregational members were acknowledged this year; Ellen Jardine for 10 years of volunteering in the office at First and a plaque was unveiled in the Sanctuary to commemorate the lifelong commitment and love Ethel Porter had for First.

First was supposed to host the Presbytery event "Church Connections" but it was postponed to a later date due to the weather, Don Haggart hosted a successful Bible Society fundraiser concert in the lower hall, at least three people were trained and certified in use of the AED machine, and Session records were examined by Presbytery and "have been attested as neatly and correctly kept".

Cards and gifts were presented to Sunday school leaders, Lynne Ann and Lois MacLellan, at June's Sunday School summer closing and at Christmas time. Our Sunday School is a small and diverse group. The children and young people did a fabulous presentation at their summer closing and Christmas programs. Thank you for sharing your gift of the "BELLS"! It was the closing highlight of the Christmas Eve service! You are all awesome! We thank God for each one of you ... as we do for teachers, parents, grandparents, friends and all who encourage you in your faith journeys.

We can smile and celebrate thinking about all the successes we had in 2019. And thanks for the faithfulness and Grace of God to see us through another year! Session would like to thank you all for your faith and the support you showed First Church throughout the year. To the people who supported us with organ supply and choir rehearsals during our organist, Lloyd MacLean's emergency surgery the end of November, JUST BEFORE CHRISTMAS!! ... No words can express how panicked we were nor how thankful we were for you, Diane Patterson, Pierre Aucoin, Katie Aucoin and Lynne DeCoste. Janice Alcorn, the choir is deeply indebted to you and was SO happy to have worked with you!! So happy for your great recovery, Lloyd! The Alcorn "family" singers, Jodie, Robyn and Natalie, I hope you have started a new Christmas Eve tradition at First with your" O Holy Night" trio arrangement!! Fabulous!! Thank you so much!
