We had a busy Advent/Christmas season at First Church. We had a group of volunteers that contributed to our community by manning the Salvation Army kettles. On Dec. 15 we had the Sunday School Christmas performance following the service. That was followed by a potluck downstairs after with cookie decorating for the children. Christmas Eve Candlelight Service was held at 7:00 pm with special music and the finale by the Children's Handbell Choir. For the final service of the year, Rev. Andrew held a Service of Healing and Annointing.

This rite can be deeply meaningful and affecting; great care should be taken to ensure that appropriate privacy is kept and that people are comfortable. It will be rewarding and important that ongoing teaching about healing and prayer is done in the congregation so that as many people as possible have a full and sufficiently informed understanding of how the Bible and church understand the practice of healing.

As people are gathered for the laying on of hands, the presider may want to lean close to hear what the individual's specific petition is. Those who take leadership in prayer will find it helpful to spend considerable time reflecting upon the most beneficial way to address certain requests so that the prayers that are offered are pastorally and theologically suitable.

One by one the presider will hear the request for healing and prayer appropriately and privately with the person.
