We tell other people about God's love and the church. We connect with lonely and sad people and encourage them. Jesus trusts us to do this work for him. If we do not do his work, there is no one else.

How about that! We trust Jesus but Jesus trusts us as well. I guess Jesus went "up" so that his work on earth would be "up" to us.

The Scripture Lesson:

Acts 1: 1 - 11

New International Version (NIV)

Tamara: Just before I read our text for today, I would like to give you a brief background to the Book of Acts. The Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts were presumably written by the same author as part of a two-part work, addressed to a person named Theophilus (which translated from Greek, means "friend of God"). In our scripture today, the author makes it clear the first book, the Gospel of Luke, focuses on Jesus' life and witness as the Son of God. The Book of Acts, of which today's scripture is the beginning, takes us to the end of Jesus' earthly ministry and then tells the story of the early Christian church, focusing on the witness of the Apostles and of the Apostle Paul.

Acts 1: 1 – 11

In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit

comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

The Meditation

Get Back To Work!

It was a promise to the disciples. They would not be left alone. They had lost him once and were already worrying about losing him again. There had been so many amazing moments with Jesus - so many miraculous things, so many people healed, and so many opportunities to learn. But there had also been the grief and sorrow at seeing their friend, teacher, and Lord taken into custody and crucified. There was the bitter taste of disappointment and guilt when they thought of their own actions, which sprang from their fear and faithlessness. Then he showed up, like he said he would. He encountered the two disciples as they went to Emmaus, then he met the twelve. But this time, Jesus' teaching was all about passing on the work, about reminding them that they would have what they needed to continue the ministry he had started. This work was the kingdom, the visible rehearsal of what would be permanent at the end of time. And then, he returned to his heavenly home.

Many Christians wonder why the Ascension is part of the Church calendar. We have been through the intensity of Lent, which was released in the excitement of Easter with triumphant music and shouts of "He is risen!". Pentecost is only a few weeks away, where we will celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church. But Ascension Sunday is a turning point. It moves us from the story of Jesus' life, told in the Gospels, that culminated with his death and resurrection. Jesus had come to earth from heaven, and now is returning to reign at the right hand of God. But this story is also about the disciples (and about us here today). Ascension is the event that changes the focus of Christ's work and ministry from Jesus himself to those who follow him. Jesus is no longer here to preach good news, heal the sick, and feed the hungry. This mission now falls to Jesus' disciples then, and us, as Jesus' disciples today.

Today, we are reminded of our identity as God's own people, as Christ's body on earth. The promise of new life in Christ is entrusted to us, so that all creation can experience the wholeness, integration, and peace of God. In our text today, we hear that, as Jesus speaks to

the disciples, he begins ascending to the right hand of God. I will bet seeing that was like watching the solar eclipse of April 8th. As we did during the eclipse, we would have stood there in awe, as Jesus rose, staring, and waiting until the last possible glance is gone.

But the disciples did not have that luxury. As Jesus was departing, two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven. In other words, the disciples were being told, "Stop staring and get back to work! Move on, there is nothing to see here..." The Jesus who broke into history once will break into history again, that is the promise. How? Through the disciples, through us, if we do not waste our time staring at the heavens! But what does it mean for us to be "staring at the heavens", rather than getting back to work?

Our faith community is a lively place, especially now, post-pandemic. We are busy with good things: worship, Christian education, groups, service opportunities, etc. But are these activities keeping us SO occupied that we no longer hear the voice of God who speaks to us in silence? You will recall that Jesus, even with all the demands on him, took the time to be quiet, to pray, to listen to his heavenly Parent. I am not saying that we should just be passive or inactive. Rather, we are being invited to stop <u>staring</u> and to start <u>seeing</u> God in those around us.

On this Ascension Sunday, I encourage you to take inventory of your life and our communal life as the Church. In what ways are you staring at the sky, waiting for Jesus to return? For myself, I know that I look outward too much, rather than taking quiet time in prayer and reflection. I am spending too much energy wondering what the future holds for the Presbyterian Church in Canada. I am despairing about the suffering in our world and wondering how I can respond. All in the name of Jesus, of course, all out of love for the body of Christ. Yet still, it is staring - being distracted from the work that God is calling me, and all of us, to do.

But I sense a new energy. In my life. In the congregations that I have the privilege of serving, and in the world. I sense a hunger for making goodness, love, and empathy visible around us. I sense a deep need for us as the Church to pay attention and to shine a light on where we see Jesus alive and well, at work around us - Jesus in our homes as we wash dishes, do laundry, care for family members, and pay the bills. Jesus in our communities as we live into our vocation to love those with whom we work and to serve those who are too often overlooked by our society. Jesus in our congregations as we sing songs of praise, share bread and cup, pray together, and then go back into the world to 'be Jesus' to those who are longing for Jesus' love and compassion.

As we look around and see Jesus, our lives are transformed. We are humbled by the many ways that Jesus shows up forgiving, restoring, continuing the work of creation from the beginning of time. The way that Jesus shows up loving, healing, and calling our name, and

the name of our neighbours. It would be easier to keep on staring - to think about how the church was "in the good old days", when the pews were packed, and the Sunday Schools were full. But Ascension calls us to pay attention here and now! It awakens us to where we are today, rooting us in the soil given to us to cultivate as workers in God's vineyard.

So, people of God, why are you looking up? In the words of St. Teresa of Avila: *Christ has no body but yours; no hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassionately on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now but yours; no hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world. Christ has no body now on earth but yours.*

It is time to stop staring! Get back to work! Amen.




t is **uplift**

arranged to visit every home, hand delivering one of these necklaces and a gift bag to each child. We spoke a blessing over each child's life, encouraging them to continue practicing what they learned at the Impact Zone, and to keep being a change in the lives of their family, friends and community. Along with this, we brought a professional photographer and offered a free photo shoot to each family. What started as a simple idea in the mind of our founder ended up inspiring a summer long project that united families and inspired youth to change their world.
