New International Version (NIV)

Now they know that everything you have given me comes from you. For I gave them the words you gave me and they accepted them. They knew with certainty that I came from you, and they believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I am not praying for the world, but for those you have given me, for they are yours. All I have is yours, and all you have is mine. And glory has come to me through them. I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them and kept them safe by that name you gave me. None has been lost except the one doomed to destruction so that Scripture would be fulfilled. "I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them. I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world. My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. Sanctify them by the

truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified.

The Meditation

Pray. Love.

Some of you may have heard of the book "Eat. Pray. Love." It was turned into a movie starring Julia Roberts and was very popular back in 2010. In the movie, Elizabeth Gilbert, the main character, says these words to herself in prayer, as she is on the edge of exhaustion:

"I'm here. I love you. I don't care if you need to stay up crying all night long, I will stay with you... [t]here's nothing you can ever do to lose my love. I will protect you until you die, and after your death I will still protect you. I am stronger than Depression and I am braver than Loneliness and nothing will ever exhaust me." (Gilbert, Elizabeth. Eat, Pray, Love. Viking Press, 2006)

These words are Elizabeth's words of prayer and reassurance to herself. These words remind her that she is loved and protected, no matter what. There are words of prayer and reassurance in our passage for today, which forms part of what is often referred to by theologians as the "farewell discourses," (found only in the Gospel of John). In the text today, we hear Jesus as he prays for his disciples and....

Stop! Let us not rush to all the other things Jesus does for or says to his disciples in the "farewell discourses". Just stop there for a moment. The context for this passage is this: it is the evening before his crucifixion, and while anticipating an immediate future that will include betrayal, trial, condemnation, beating, and execution, Jesus is not praying that God will somehow save him from this terrible fate. Instead, Jesus Stops. Everything. And. Prays. For. Those. He. Loves.

That is incredible? Thinking about Jesus praying for those he loves? It is amazing, because here is the thing: prayer is not solely a routine, or spiritual exercise. It is not even just a healthy part of our faith lives. It may be all those things, but it is also something more. Prayer is love. Taking the time that we do in our Prayers of the People, in our own silent daily prayers, in our monthly Prayer Calendar, to name the hopes, joys, concerns, fears, and thanksgiving of someone you know (or for those you do not know, but hear about in the news) and bring all of that into the presence of God through prayer is an act of love, plain and simple. It expresses your care, your concern, and your compassion for the one(s) for whom you are praying. And, on this Christian Family Sunday, think about your life and the people in that life, whether family by blood or by choice. I am guessing you love all those people, right? And while we have no control over the decision, at birth God entrusts us to parental caregivers, who love

and nurture us. Parents and guardians, in turn, entrust the children they love to other caregivers and in time to school systems. Eventually they grow up and go out on their own, perhaps having children of their own. So, all they can do at that point is pray for them and entrust them to God. But those prayers are important! Praying for others – family, friends, loved ones - expresses your trust that they are as important to God as they are to you. Prayer is love. It is that simple.

But because so few of us are comfortable praying out loud or for one another, we often do not get to share that love. Which might mean that sharing a few pointers on prayer today is timely. And Jesus' prayer offers two in particular:

- 1) Prayer is a chance to remind ourselves of all our blessings and to give thanks for them. Jesus takes the opportunity to recognize the disciples and their devotion "they have obeyed your word" and give thanks for them. Do you know how powerful it can be to hear someone thank God for you? I thank God every day for each of you, but I just want to say it out loud right now.
- 2) Prayer is a chance to share our deepest concerns, worries, and fears and to ask for help. Notice how honest Jesus is about his concerns. He knows it is going to be hard for his disciples, that the world will be challenging for them, and does not hide that. Prayer is a time to tell the truth the truth about what is happening in our congregation, in our community, in our world.

If you read just a bit further into the text, you will also read in verse 20, "*I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message*." And here is the thing: We – all of those who are gathering to hear the spoken word this week – are among those who believe because of the testimony of others. Think about it: the disciples shared the word, and so did those who believed their testimony, and so on and so on. On this Christian Family Sunday, how many of you heard the Word from your parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle or other relative who shared the word with us and helped us believe? And how many of you have shared the Word with your family members? Jesus did not only stop to pray for his disciples on the evening of the crucifixion, He. Also. Prayed. For. Us. Here and now!

Jesus prayed for us, and has been praying for us ever since, and continues to hold us in the center of his heart. This does not guarantee an easy life, let alone the material comforts and riches we all wish we could have. It does not save us from illness, pain, disappointment, brokenness, or loss. It does not, as Jesus acknowledged, remove us from the world and all its challenges (or beauty!). But it does mean that Jesus is with us, cares for us, loves us, prayed, and continues to pray for us. Pretty darn amazing!

We as Presbyterians like to enjoy food and fellowship together. And we will do that after the service today. For that, I give thanks. And I bet when you heard the beginning of this service, and the words "Eat. Pray. Love", you thought I was going to talk about that! But I wanted to focus on the second two words, "Pray" and "Love", because they remind us that

when Jesus prays, he shows love. For us. All for us and always for us. Which makes it possible for us to do the same for others. So today, Eat by all means! But also, be like Jesus - Pray, and Love! Amen.




P. A. DAY CAMP - MAY 31st
