APPROACH TO THE WORD

*Choral Introit 260: "Alleluia, alleluia, give thanks to the risen Lord" (verses 2, 4)

*Call to Worship:

In today, in yesterday, and in all the days to come, we see that Christ is risen indeed. In the sunrise, in the rainfall, in the first plant to sprout, we see that Christ is risen indeed. In the breath of our bodies, in the work of our hands, we see that Christ is risen indeed. In the first step taken, the first word spoken, the first arm extended, we see that Christ is risen indeed; hallelujah!

*Hymn 522: "We know that Christ is raised and dies no more" Prayer of Adoration and Confession:

L: God of the third day of resurrection, the first day of new beginnings, and the seventh day of rest: in the story of Easter you show us your creative power at work, bringing life from lifelessness, hope from hopelessness, and assuring us that destruction can never have the last word. Together with the disciples, we are reminded that all empires are finite, and though the enemies of life and love may do their worst, your Kingdom is everlasting, and lives wherever two or three are gathered in your name. And so we see your face in the warmth of the sun, in the lengthening of the days, in every plant that shoots forth amid the concrete, and in all people who work for your justice, your truth, your peace, and your love. All praise be to you, O God and Source of Life, through your resource to a son in the witelity of the Holy Spirit

through your resurrected Son, in the vitality of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

All: God of radiance and renewal:

in the resurrection you show us a hope that no cruelty can defeat, and a persistence of life that no force can extinguish. Yet we confess that it is difficult to imagine a world where mercy overcomes might. We may cling to old fabricated narratives, doubting the depth of possibility that is You. We may crave the comfort of certainty rather than seek You in the cloud of unknowing. Forgive us for those times we have failed to take that leap of faith. Grant us the courage to embrace the emptiness where unknowing transfigures into possibility and uncertainty gives way to trusting in You.
