It is a good statement, but the session would like to expand it and therefore is proposing that the following **Congregational Statement** be added and adopted at the congregational meeting planned for November 3, 2019. Please speak with any member of session if you have feedback to offer.

We are a welcoming, reformed Christian community of faith that values inclusivity, affirming and honouring the diversity of God's creation. We believe we are stronger together.

Relying on the enduring love and grace of God, we endeavor to follow Jesus' example of caring for the most vulnerable in society and make a positive difference in the world.

We look for meaning through intellectual engagement and sacred reflection. We believe that science and religion are compatible – we have to learn each other's language.

We believe that harmony with the divine implies a good relationship with the earth – caring for all creation responsibly while walking humbly with God.

We seek to provide safe space so that each person can bring every aspect of their identity as they participate in the life of this community. We would like to know each other better.

The session of Knox Church is calling on the congregation to **elect up to three people** to serve as ruling elders. <u>Between September 29 and October 13</u>, you are invited to nominate members of the congregation you believe would serve the congregation well as ruling elders. **Nominations must be in writing and made by at least two persons, either separately or together.**

<u>Interviews with nominees will take place between October 15 and 24</u>. On Sunday, October 27 letters and ballots will be distributed to all members of the congregation. There will be a **Congregational Meeting on November 3** during worship to cast your votes. **All ballots must be returned by the end of worship on Sunday, November 10 when a special meeting of session will be convened to count the votes.**

The ordination/admission of newly elected elders will take place during worship on Sunday, December 1.


Worshipping God in love and joy – sharing our gifts – reaching out in faith to the world.
