Prayer for Understanding

Scripture: Deuteronomy 8:7-18

For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper.

You shall eat your fill and bless the LORD your God for the good land that he has given you. Take care that you do not forget the LORD your God, by failing to keep his commandments, his ordinances, and his statutes, which I am commanding you today.

When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good.

Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth." But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.

<u>Message</u>

Do you ever forget something?

I forget where I put things. In a rush I put things down and then when I am in a rush I forget where I put them down.

It's funny I think being busy, being in a rush -stress these may all be part of being forgetful ... what do you think? It often happens with my keys. It's funny in a way ... keys are supposed to help me get where I am going, they are meant to help get me into my place ... but when you forget where your keys are ... you get stuck ... stuck until you remember your keys ...

Maybe you agree ... being in a rush is part of being forgetful.

Maybe I've lost you already and you can't remember what we're talking about. Can you remember? Or maybe we all have collective forgetfulness?

Collective forgetfulness. I think this is a thing. Don't you? This is why we collectively mark important things such as Remembrance Day and Thanksgiving ... in order that we collectively remember ... sacrifice and providence.

In our passage from Deuteronomy, we are reminded to thankful and no to become too prideful.

Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth." But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.

It isn't just a problem for the people of ancient times, it is an everyday problem for people. We let pride and success go to our heads. This is why it's so easy to find quotes and books and instruction about how NOT to success lead to failure.

One thing that I often hear is that success often is related to core values, whereas failure comes from overstepping or taking too big a risk or going beyond the scope of business or expertise ... or plainly forgetting one's mission or goal.

In 2009 The New York Times almost went out of business. Today they are very profitable again because they remembered what they were: a news reporting agency. When they were facing bankruptcy one of the things they had to sell was their share of the Boston Red Sox. That's right ... Boston's baseball team was partly owned by the New York Times.

The New York Times sold their sox and many other assets unrelated to reporting and news and today they are a very profitable company again.

They remembered who they were. They sacrificed ... especially the nonessential ... and today they are doing what their name says they should be doing: reporting the news. And their shareholders, I am sure are thankful and grateful.

It started with remembering who they were.

In our reading the Israelites are just about to enter the land and Moses is telling them how important it will be to remember who they were ... and whose they are ... and to remember this.

Remember says Moses ... to remember and be thankful.

The land is good. There will be plenty. The land will yield many good things. God says build homes and enjoy the flourishing of the flocks and the crops ... but when you become wealthy don't forget who brought you here.

Don't forget who gave you the land. And stay humble and thankful.

He says it will be easy to forget to be thankful when you're managing your households and your flocks and your vineyards and enjoying all that is now yours.

You will be working hard ... very hard ... and you'll admire your work ... and maybe sometimes in the business you'll forget who made it all possible because in all your hard work and effort you'll come to believe that you deserve everything you have ... because of your hard work alone.

You'll forget where you came from and you'll forget whose you are.

Here is a couple of things to remember:

when we forget to give thanks to God for all that we have, we forget about grace. Nothing happens without grace. Nothing grows ... nothing is fruitful ... nothing good comes to us ... except by the grace of God.

When we forget this we forget that it is God who lifts us up ... when we forget we believe by our pride that we have earned everything ... when almost everything is by grace. God provides.

when we forget to be grateful, we become entitled. Hard work may make some of us wealthy hard work also makes us feel entitled NOT ONLY to what we have but that which we can still get. When we forget to be grateful ... we forget to be thankful to God and we risk forgetting to be generous to our neighbours.

Moses warns the people ... don't forget. You're going to be busy managing your wealth and assets ... don't forget that you are God's people ... and the people of God never forget where every good thing comes from ...

Here is one of those quotes I was telling you about:

"Never let success get to your head; never let failure get to your heart." -Anonymous

Moses would agree with the statement: never let success get to your head ... it is what these verses are all about. But more importantly Jesus would remind us that the other statement is also true: never let failure get to your heart ...

Moses says the statutes of God should never be forgotten and never leave your consciousness ... but Jesus would say ... that each of us is ... close to God's heart ... never forget that. And keep God closest in your heart.

And then Jesus would say also: even if something else takes God's place in your heart ... don't let that failure consume your heart. But when you remember whose you are ... rejoice ... and be thankful ... as we put down our pride of place ... let us also put down our shame in failure ... and let our hearts be full again ... full again with the gifts of God ... with hearts full be thankful ...

This is the key to remembering ... the key to remembering whose we are ... the key to remembering the source of every good thing ... the key to remembering to be thankful ... these are the keys ... don't forget the keys ... don't forget your keys ...
