Reflection

This is a special time of year – filled with expectations and traditions – reminiscences and dreams. Some of us, because of the death of a loved one or family member – because of a powerful memory of long ago, because of unemployment, because of abuse or neglect, because of depression and a sense of lost hope – some of us are having difficulty celebrating during this

Many of us can no doubt relate to being at a high point in our life when, almost without warning, a single event casts us into a desert – a desert of anger or regret – a desert of sadness or fear – a desert of silence – of lost hope – a desert of despair – of wandering.

Today, in the name of Jesus, the Christ, we call upon the angels of the Lord to come and attend each one of us in as we set down our burdens – if only for a short time – through faith in Jesus. We ask God to bring us new understanding – healing and fresh hope – the promise of new beginnings. By the power of the Holy Spirit may we be open and ready to receive God's great love. **Amen**

Lighting the Advent Candles

Kittie: We light the candle of hope, awaiting the birth of Jesus, our source of hope. (Candle of hope is lit)

Anne: May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (*Romans 15:13*)

Together: Thank you, O God, for the gift of hope in our times of emptiness and despair.

Kittie: We light the candle of peace, knowing that Jesus is the Prince of Peace. (Candle of peace is lit)

Anne: Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world. (John 14:27, 16:33)

Together: Thank you, O God, for the gift of peace in our times of uncertainty and fear.

Kittie: We light the candle of joy, knowing our comfort and help come from God. (Candle of joy is lit)

Anne: To the one who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you before God's glorious presence without fault and with great joy – to the only God our Saviour be glory, majesty, power and authority, through Jesus Christ our Lord, before all ages, now and forevermore! Amen. (Jude 1: 24-25)

Together: Thank you, O God, for the gift of joy – for happy memories – for your presence in our times of sadness.

Kittie: We light the candle of love, knowing God is love revealed to us in Jesus. (Candle of love is lit)

Anne: I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. *(Ephesians 3: 17-19)*

Together: Thank you, O God, for the gift of love in our times of longing and loneliness.

Kittie: In him was life, and that life was the light of all. We light the Christ candle, knowing Jesus is our hope, our peace, our joy, and the source of abundant love. (The Christ candle is lit)

Anne: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it. (*John 1: 1 and 5*)

Together: The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. (John 1:14)

Prayer
