## PWS&D Message A Refugee Mother's Struggles in Pakistan

Jehan and her children fled their home in Afghanistan after the Taliban took over in 2021. "For many days, we were surviving on the streets of Islamabad. A kind man took us in," she explains. Now, they share a house in Pakistan with eight other refugee families.

Jehan found out that she was expecting her sixth child just before her husband died in crossfire between two rival groups in Afghanistan. While she gave birth to a healthy baby girl, the family had left all of their belongings behind when they fled Afghanistan and she had nothing for the newborn. Jehan was also unable to afford food to meet the family's needs.

Earlier this year, Jehan and her family were selected to receive cash assistance from a PWS&D project supporting Afghan refugees in Pakistan. With this aid, she was able to buy food and other life-giving essentials for herself and her kids.

Thank you for faithfully responding to Christ's call to care for families who have fled danger. Through PWS&D, we can provide vulnerable families with essential life-saving items.

Jesus was crucified, died, and was buried, but you raised him from the dead – and like his disciples we meet him again in the breaking of bread as we gather around this table.

We remember and give thanks, O God, that as Jesus sat at the table with friends – sharing the fruit of the vine and the harvest of the fields – he took bread, blessed it, broke it and shared it, saying: "Take – eat – this is my body which is for you. Do this to remember me."

When supper was over, he took a cup of wine and raised it, saying: "This is God's new covenant, made possible because of my death. Drink this all of you, to remember me."

As we gather in the promise of Christ, we proclaim the mystery of faith...
