The Story of the Table

Whenever we gather at this table, we hear the story of how God's love set this table for us, to heal our past and set us free for the future. On the night he was betrayed by friends, Jesus came to the table with those very friends. He took bread and blessed it. He broke the bread and said: "Take this, all of you, and eat it. This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me."

When the meal was ended, he took a cup and passed it among his friends saying: "This is the cup of the new covenant, sealed in my blood for the forgiveness of sin. Drink this all of you."

So now we do as Jesus did, taking the bread and the cup. In these gifts, Jesus has promised to be present. Through these Christ can make us whole. Thanks be to God.

Sharing Bread and Cup

Please come forward to receive Holy Communion – everyone is welcome at this table. If you are unable to come to the front, please signal an elder who will come and serve you.

We use gluten and dairy-free bread. Juice, wine, and pre-packaged elements are available.

The one who breathed on the first disciples, is present for us in this bread. The one whose Spirit stirred the Church at Pentecost, now revives us in this cup. In these gifts God comes to us so that we may come to God. The bread of life – the cup of joy – we remember and share with thanksgiving.
