Peter: I was saying that I'm not the world's best administrator and you haven't given me

much of a clue as to what I should do.

Jesus: What do you mean?

Peter: Well, for example... who is the church for?

Is it just for the Jews?

Jesus: No.

Peter: Is it just for Gentiles?

Jesus: No.

Peter: Is it for everybody?

Jesus: Mm-hm.

Peter: Including women???

Jesus: Mm-hm.

Peter: Do you know what you're letting yourself in for?

I mean, do you know what you're letting me in for?

Jesus: You mean they might get things organized?

Peter: Well... yes...

Jesus: And that would be a new experience... wouldn't it?

Peter: Well... well...

Look, quite apart from the women, what do you want the men to do?

Do you want us to sing... standing up or sitting down?

Do you want us ti kneel to pray or stretch our hands in the air?

Do you want candles and incense... or is the church to be a no-smoking zone?

Are there to be speakers or silence?

Do you want drums and trumpets and organs? I mean, Thomas suggested guitars, but I told him that guitars gave God a sore head.

Jesus: What gave you that impression?

Peter: Amos 5, verse 23... remember?

Jesus: Oh... right... I think you may have misinterpreted that passage.

Peter: And another thing, Jesus... how do you want it run?

Jesus: Run?

Peter: Yes... how do you want it run?

James says it should be a territorial democracy. Andrew thought it might be a centralized bureaucracy. Simon said that people should do as they please... be he's

just an anarchist!

What do you say?

Jesus: Not very much.

Peter: Jesus, be serious.

I mean... you said you were going to build the church on me, but you don't give me

a clue as to what it should look like.

What happens if you disappear, and I drop dead? Will the whole thing go up in a

puff of smoke?

Jesus: Well, that would be an interesting way of finding your successor.

Peter: Pardon?

Jesus: Peter, Peter, don't worry about the church. That's God's problem, not yours. You

set your eyes on the kingdom and God will make clear what should be the shape of

the church.

For God want the church to be the servant of the kingdom, not the master – to celebrate the kingdom, not to dominate it – to be a sign of the good news, not just a reminder of the bad.

The apostles gathered around Jesus and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat.

And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things.

When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; send them away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat."

But he answered them, "You give them something to eat."

They said to him, "Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give it to them to eat?"

And he said to them, "How many loaves have you? Go and see."

When they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish."

Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and blessed and broke the loaves and gave them to his disciples to set before the people, and he divided the two fish among them all. And all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.

If you are unable to come forward, please signal by raising a hand and we will come to serve you. We are using gluten and dairy-free bread. Juice, wine, and pre-packaged elements are available.

**Laura:** We have heard about God, who loved confusion into order and gave each creature a divine image, making the world.

**Mitch:** We have heard about Jesus, a poor man whose banquet feeds the world, a healer whose wounds give life, a teacher whose wisdom traces love's order in the world, finding the divine in each of us.

**Laura:** We have heard how Jesus died, and how, for those who loved him, he rose again.

**Mitch:** We have heard about the Holy Spirit, who breaks the bonds of race and class, of gender and creed, to show God's love for everyone.

**Laura:** And we have heard that love makes all things new. We come to share in the bread of such blessings. These miracles begin with simple human gestures, bits of bread in a basket, tongues that talk, souls that yearn. And so, we bring bread and wine, prayers and our own yearning, that the miraculous may begin in us today.

**Mitch:** Almighty and merciful God, in the face of much that seems to deny your presence, we give you grateful thanks for Jesus. We thank you for revealing yourself to us in him. We thank you that in his death and resurrection he has overcome all that can destroy us. We thank you that nothing in our lives can ever separate us from your love.
