### Scripture Song of Solomon 2:8-13 (OT 623)

The voice of my beloved! Look, he comes, leaping upon the mountains, bounding over the hills. My beloved is like a gazelle or a young stag. Look, there he stands behind our wall, gazing in at the windows, looking through the lattice.

My beloved speaks and says to me: "Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away; or now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land. The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines are in blossom; they give forth fragrance. Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away."

### James 1:17-27 (NT 229)

Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures.

You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls.

But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like. But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act –they will be blessed in their doing.

If any think they are religious, and do not bridle their tongues but deceive their hearts, their religion is worthless. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

# Listen to what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

<u>Message</u> (including a few words from some enthusiastic campers!)

James names God: *the Father of lights* – the creator of the sun and the moon and the stars in the heavens – Creator of all that is. God creates the beauty of the natural world, God creates each one of us to live in it and God desires much for us and from us. *The Father of lights* breathes life into us by the power of the Holy Spirit so that we will become the very best of creation, the cream of the crop, the fulfilment of God's desire. James reminds his community of this – reminds them of who they are – whose they are. They are – we are – God's creation. It is easy to forget in the routine humdrum of life that God fills us with *the word of truth* and hopes what is best for us.

How can we remind ourselves that we are – like the sun and the moon and the stars – created by God for God's purposes? For many people, camping is how they do that and for Christians, church camp is a way to reconnect with both creation and their faith.

Camping has been part of the Canadian Christian experience for more than a hundred years. One source I found *described how Presbyterian churches joined with other denominations to sponsor "fresh air camps" in the late 1800's. These camps gave urban young people an opportunity for play and moral instruction outside the cities.* My guess is that camps were at the height of their popularity in the 1950's when mainline churches were flourishing.

Church camping is a different kind of camping, in that the focus is on God as the centre of all life, and the focal point of every day's activities. In a 1958 book called, <u>Camping</u> <u>Together as Christians</u>, we read that *church camp [can] provide an experience in Christian living… helping campers to encounter God at work in the processes of creation… Fellowship is real because [participants] come to know one another with a depth of feeling seldom experienced elsewhere within the church.* There is something special about the camp experience, whether a summer day camp, family camp, youth event, or retreat – it is one of the paths of our Christian journey.

Church camp is one of the most successful modes of Christian education and leadership development. The growth of Christian faith and character through living together in a camp community is carried back to individual congregations by campers and staff in the form of on-going service in the name of Jesus Christ. I have heard it said that one week at camp is equal to a year of church school!

Christian camping is special. It provides the opportunity to see life just a little differently than we do every day. Each time a camp begins a unique Christian community is born and sustained during the extent of the time together. Camps are not just for children and youth. More and more adults are seeking camp and retreat experiences. It is time away from regular lives, sustained opportunity for building relationships, and the chance to rejoice in the beauty of God's creation. Central is the caring, loving and learning place camp becomes for all who experience it.

Camps and retreats have long been defining experiences designed to encourage people to hear, respond and develop as spiritual leaders called to inspire and lead others in lives of love. Part of their purpose is to help participants connect the learning and transformation at camp or on retreat with new ways of being and living in the world.

**Bruce and Ruth McCowan** are some of the most avid campers I know, and they are keen to share their thoughts on church camping with you...

Jean and Arthur Marcellus shared these reflections about church camping...

Camp VIP is an opportunity for anyone from our Vancouver Island Presbyterian Churches (Camp VIP) to camp and have fellowship together. Camp VIP had been a camp for children and teens for many years, along with a Family Camp at Rathtrevor during the long weekend of August. We now have Family Camps for everyone, three times a year in June, July and August.

Jean had her first experience at Family Camp in 1990 when Andrew McCowan was an infant! She remembers it so well. Jean went on to be a counsellor, a director and kitchen staff for the children's side of Camp VIP. Arthur heard about Camp VIP when his boys came home all smiles talking about their new friends, the fun games and showing us their cool t-shirts and craftwork. Soon after, Arthur was volunteering as a dishwasher and enjoyed spraying any of the kids who just had to poke their head in the kitchen window!

They love Camp VIP because it is an amazing opportunity to see friends old and new each year, catch up on news about family and friends and share their walk with the Lord. They have so many friends from all over Vancouver Island because of Camp VIP.

At Camp VIP you can take your pick of activities - crafts, board games, going for walks, swimming, bicycling, reading, no-run baseball, croquet, lots of visiting and conversation, singing, praying, campfire, smores, and most importantly, a theme speaker at Circle Time each evening, which strengthens Christian faith. Friends often inquire, *"How many*"

*camping trips were you on this year?"* We always start by saying, *"Well, first of all we went to three Church Camp VIPs." "Oh what's that?"* and then the real conversation starts! Jean and Arthur keep coming back because they can't imagine what a year would be like without going to camp. Something would be missing, big time, in their yearly adventures!

The banner on display today was created at the July camp this year, having received advice from Kitty Ure and encouragement from Laura. The children and the 'big' children really 'got into' the paint and the placing of their hands. There are some direct similarities to the lovely banner we have in our foyer.

If you enjoy camping, meeting other fellow Presbyterian's, and hearing the Word of God in the great Vancouver Island outdoors, have a look at the Camp VIP website for more information and registration.

In James' letter we read about a community of faith and how it needs to behave. We read about a community that has been blessed with *the implanted word that has the power to save your souls.* A community that needs to connect the truth it has heard and the salvation it has received with its way of being and living. We are reminded that doing is as integral to faith as hearing – that religion that is all talk and no action is worthless.

There is a connection here with the camp experience. There is sharing and learning from one another – expressing thoughts and deep feelings, not only about our faith, but also about each other that creates a special kind of fellowship, the same kind that Christ created with his disciples – a closeness achieved through community with Christ which is a totally different closeness from that experienced apart from Christ. Through the gift of that safe and nurturing community it is possible to move beyond words to action – to risk more than might have been risked otherwise – to become *not hearers who forget but doers who act* – and to be blessed in the doing. **Amen**
