Responsive Lessons drawn from the Old and New Testaments

In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while the Spirit of God swept over the face of the waters. (Gen. 1:1-2)

Then the Lord God formed a human of dust from the ground and breathed into its nostrils the breath of life, and the human became a living creature. (Genesis 2:7)

The Spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life. (Job 33:4) Teach me to do your will, for you are my God! Let your good Spirit lead me on level ground! (Psalm 143:10)

And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. (Ezekiel 36:26a) And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. (Joel 2:28)

Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? (Psalm 139:7)

I will not hide my face anymore from them, when I pour out my Spirit upon the house of Israel. (Ezekiel 39:29)

For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour my Spirit upon your offspring, and my blessing on your descendants. (Isaiah 44:3)

And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statues and to be careful to obey my commandments. (Ezekiel 36:27)

"This is my covenant", says the Lord: "My Spirit that is upon you, and my words that I have put into your mouth, shall not depart from you or your offspring or your children's offspring" says the Lord, "from this time forth and forevermore." (Isaiah 59:21)

When Jesus was baptized, the heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:21-22)

When Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it is written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free. (Luke 4:16-18)

The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit. (John 3:8)

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him, but you know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you. (John 14:16-17)

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. (Acts 2:1-4)

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. (Romans 8:14)

And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. (Romans 5:5)

Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness; For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. (Romans 8:26) May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all. (2 Corinthians 13:14)
