Simple Contemplative practices

Each week during this summer's worship series we will be encouraged to introduce a weekly contemplative practice. Week 1 contemplative action is to pour yourself a glass of water. As you drink it, think about how water sustains us and is a source of LIFE! And then refill that same glass and water another living thing... offering a

glass of water to someone else (maybe use a clean glass) or water an indoor plant, refresh your pup's water dish, a tree on your property, your favourite garden beauty, a bird bath etc.

Consider creating a reminder note that says,

"Water is life. Water your life so you can water other life... for the beauty of the earth.

You are encouraged to keep this an a contemplative practice all summer - try picking a day to remind you that "Water is LIFE!" and complete the action that day! There will be six weeks of contemplative practices for you to continue through out the summer months.

Paying Attention

Ministries with Indigenous People

All summer we are learning more about Presbyterian Ministries with Indigenous people. This week we highlight **Edmonton Urban Native Ministry – Edmonton**, **AB**

Edmonton Urban Native Ministries (EUNM)

operates under the call to "lift up your H.E.A.D.S." The acronym points to the five pillars of their mission: healing, evangelism, awakening, development, and sending. With this mission in mind, the ministry offers a range of services to First Nation individuals through their drop-in centre, located at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church.

In addition to providing for physical needs with hot meals, a clothing bank, an emergency food bank, bus tickets, and haircuts; EUNM also caters to spiritual needs through morning devotionals, prayer, Bible sharing, and worship services. Additionally, they offer tae kwon do lessons, music lessons, vacation Bible school, and local camp scholarships for First Nation children and youth. Where complex issues of addiction, violence, sexual exploitation, homelessness, and poverty exist, EUNM attempts to meet affected individuals with the love of Jesus.

During the covid19 crisis challenges to the ministries with Indigenous people have multiplied and funding has been problematic like many charities which provide essential services to communities where poverty and crisis are often a part of everyday life.
