When we set ourselves on negative things each day we miss the grandeur and beauty of God's promises to us!

God's mercies are new every morning. The Hebrew word for “new” used here is

chadash meaning “fresh, new thing, to rebuild”. Isaiah 43:19 says,

“Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall you not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.”

Every morning, God’s river of mercies flows fresh into us. Each “morning” is **boquer**, which means “dawn, to pour out, to spread out as a fruitful vine.” What an amazing illustration! *Can you smell and taste the wonderful bounty of God’s fruit of mercies as they spread out each dawn?*

God’s faithfulness is great. The Hebrew word for “great” as used in this verse is **rab** meaning “abundant, abound.” Webster’s Dictionary defines “abundant” as “marked by great plenty.” God’s faithfulness is God’s **emunah** which is “firmness, security, fidelity, stability, truth.” We stand firmly on and securely in God’s faithfulness. Webster defines “fidelity” as “the quality or state of being.” There is no better quality of life than the one found in the faithfulness of God. God’s faithfulness is the true breakfast of champions.

Siblings in Christ, set a cup and plate on your beside table ready to accept God’s abundant offerings each and every morning! DON’t be afraid to go to sleep with expectancy in your spirits and in your heart, and look forward to waking up to God’s fresh mercies each and every morning.

Orange T-shirt Day Sept. 31st

Orange Shirt Day began in 1973 when six-year-old Phyllis Webstad entered the St. Joseph Mission Residential School in B.C. Young Phyllis was wearing a brand-new and beloved orange shirt for her first day of school, but the Mission Oblates stripped her of her new shirt and replaced it with the school's institutional uniform. The loss of an orange shirt was by no means the worst thing that happened to an Indigenous child in the Indian Residential School System, but it has become symbolic of all that was taken from the children—their language, culture, family and community relationships, safety, security and identity, sometimes even their lives.

When we wear orange shirts and talk about why we are wearing them, we help to build awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of Indian Residential Schools, and we witness to the truth that Every Child Matters.

In this video, Vivian Ketchum, originating from Wauzhushk Onigum Nation of Northern Ontario, and a member of Place of Hope Presbyterian Church in Winnipeg, Man., talks about why she wears an orange shirt, and why it is important for members of the church to mark September 30.
