
# Halloween (All Hollows Eve) & All Saints' Day

This weekend has two holidays: Halloween and All Saints' Day. History and tradition tell us that these two holidays developed both separately and together. Celebrations of the harvest existed among many cultures,

and the early church held vigils to honor the memory of the saints. As both of these days grew in significance among the faithful, a shared purpose emerged. Either holiday can stand on its own, but each has more to teach us when we look at them together.

#### **Darkness and light**

If you've ever walked out of a movie theatre on a sunny summer afternoon, you know the sun can be "blinding." But on the same day, if you've been at the beach or out in nature all morning, the afternoon sun doesn't seem so bright; same sunshine, different point of comparison. Halloween has a lot of elements that are far from



sacred however, the use of dark colours and creepy masks and the concept of warding off evil is purposeful. There is something to be said for placing a source of light in the darkness, as in the Jack-O-latern. Ann Frank wrote, *"Look at how a single candle can both defy and define the darkness."* All Hollows Eve can be a moment of defying darkness. On the following day traditionally Christians decorated the church in white paraments—the cloths that cover the altar and pulpit—and would often light candles in celebration of the goodness of the souls that have gone on to God in the past year. The brightness of All Saints' Day is even brighter because we lived through the eve of darkness (All Hollows Eve.)

The Bible is fantastic literature because of its vibrant descriptions of events, landscapes, and emotions. The use of darkness—a place of nighttime, sometimes a place of fear and/or pain, and often a place of waiting—is contrasted with the use of lightness —a place of daytime, sometimes a place of vibrant boldness, sometimes a place of peace, and sometimes a place of revelation. It is the light and dark working together that offer us expressions of God's presence in our lives. When we are in the places of fear or pain whether physical, spiritual or both, God is with us, offering us vibrant boldness and peace.



### **Pumpkin Prayer Intructions**

Dear Jesus, Open my mind so I can learn about You.

As you cut the top of the pumpkin, talk about ways God helps us to learn about God's love, God's creation and God's promises. "Know that the Lord, He is

#### God." (Psalm 100:3)

#### Take all my sin and forgive the wrong things that I do.

Scoop out the inside of the pumpkin to show how God removes our sins (seeds of greed, impatience, jealousy, hatred) and forgives us. God cleanses our hearts and makes us a new creation!

*"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us"*(1 John 1:9) **Open my eyes so Your love I will see.** 

As you carve the eyes in the shape of a hearts, discuss how God's laws are to protect us from harm, and so that we learn to treat others with the same love and protection as God gives us!

*"Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things from your law." (Psalm 119:18) I'm sorry for times I've turned up my nose at what You've given me.* Carve a cross-shaped nose and ask, "What does it mean to turn our nose up at something? 'Turning up our nose' means we don't like it. Sometimes we don't like a certain food or toy or shirt. When we are not thankful and grumble about what we have (or don't have), we have complaining heartrs. But we have been given so much! When we remember that Jesus died on the cross for us, we know that God has given us all we really need."

"...be thankful unto Him, and bless his name." (Psalm 100:4)

**Open my ears so Your word I will hear.** Carve the ears into a rectangle to represent the Bible and ask, "Do your parents ever have to tell you to do something more than once?" Just like our parents, God wants us to listen to the commandments of Jesus. The tells us Bible how much God loves us, how God wants us to live, and how God will help us. *"Incline your ear, and come to Me"* (Isaiah 55:3)

**Open my mouth to tell others You're near.** Carve the mouth into the shape of a fish. Jesus told His disciples that they would no longer catch fish but would instead fish for people by telling them about God's love for them. We can be "fishers of men" and use our mouths to tell others about Jesus, too. "I shall . . . declare the works or the Lord" (Psalm 118:17)

Let Your light shine in all I say and do! Amen. Light a candle and place it inside the pumpkin. The light stands for the Holy Spirit that lives in us. When we are open to God's work in our lives, God will shine through us so others will see God's love in us. Then our friends and family will be drawn to this light and love, too! Jesus said, *"Let your light so shine before all, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."*(Matthew 5:16)

Consider joining Rev. Shelly and others in praying through "Praying for 31 Countries Around the World Where Religious Persecution is High" a resources provided by national offices. WE will begin this Sunday. The country, information and prayers will be posted on our website and on Facebook.

### What is prayer and why do we pray for those persecuted for their faith?

"Prayer is deeply rooted in Christian life and practice. The Scriptures don't only tell us the story of salvation; they also overflow with prayers written out of the depths of human response to God's work and presence, and to the daily pains, joys, doubts, and gratitudes that humans experience. Prayer is praise, thanksgiving, lament, rejoicing, asking, receiving and listening. It is response-to and relationship-with God. Living Faith reminds us,

Life in Christ involves prayer,

The seeking of God's will and blessing

On all of life.

Prayer is openness to the presence of God.

In words, or the absence of words,

Prayer is the focusing of our lives toward God.

As we commune with God through Jesus Christ,

The Holy Spirit enables us to express our deepest longings, And we experience the sustaining power of God's presence.

(Living Faith, 8.1.4 2)

Prayer is thus an important part of Christian life and spiritual practice. The centrality of prayer to healthy Christian spiritual life demonstrates why it is important, among one's prayers, to pray for people in difficult circumstances including Christians who are persecuted for their faith and for the very prayers they make. Sharing in a life of communal prayer, we lend our voices to those suffering for their faith, even while we as a church take additional meaningful

action to aid them through avenues such as advocacy and the sharing of resources.

It is of course not just Christians who pray. Other religions have prayer as part of their practice as well and Living Faith also reminds us, *Some whom we encounter belong to other religions And already have a faith.* 

Their lives often give evidence of devotion

And reverence for life.

We recognize that truth and goodness in them Are the work of God's Spirit, the author of all truth.

(Living Faith, 9.2.1)

#### And

Justice involves protecting the rights of others. It protests against everything that destroys human dignity. (Living Faith, 8.4.3)

Recognizing the work of God's Spirit in the truth and goodness of those whose religion differs from ours, as well as in those Christians persecuted for their faith, we can see that to be unable to practice one's religion in safety is an injustice that destroys human dignity. We pray therefore for all those who face violence for their faith; that their rights will be upheld and their dignity restored." (an excerpt from "Praying for 31 Countries Around the World Where Religious Persecution is High" - A resource produced by the International Affairs Committee of the PCC)
