Thank you for joining with us to pray 75 Prayers throughout 2022, in recognition of PWS&D's 75th anniversary!

Prayer is deeply rooted in Christian life and practice. The Scriptures not only tell us the story of salvation; they also overflow with prayers written out of the depths of human response to God's work and presence, and to the daily pains, joys, doubts, and gratitude that humans experience. Prayer is praise, thanksgiving, lament, rejoicing, asking, receiving and listening. It is response-to and relationship-with God. Living Faith reminds us.

Life in Christ involves prayer, The seeking of God's will and blessing On all of life. Prayer is openness to the presence of God. In words, or the absence of words, Prayer is the focusing of our lives toward God. As we commune with God through Jesus Christ,

The Holy Spirit enables us to express our deepest longings, And we experience the sustaining power of God's presence.

(Living Faith, 8.1.4)¹

Prayer is thus an important part of our lives, both individually and as we worship God in community.

In this guide, you'll find prayers for specific PWS&D programs and emergency responses, prayers from PWS&D's global partners and ecumenical coalitions, and prayers taken from the Bible² or the Book of Praise.3

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Using this guide at home:

These prayers can be used in private or family devotion times to remember the needs of people around the world in prayer. If praying one prayer per day, you will complete the prayers in approximately two and a half months.

Before beginning to pray, take a moment to quiet your heart, asking the Holy Spirit to be present with you. Reflect on anything you might have heard this day or week among your congregation or in the news—a request for support for a family of refugees who have just arrived in your community, a testimony in PWS&D's e-newsletter about the difference access to education made for somebody in Guatemala or Afghanistan, a breaking story on the news about a natural disaster that has left people without homes or food. Trust this to God in prayer.

After you've said the prayer in this guide, consider closing your time with God with a repetition of a prayer. Here is one example:

Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Using this guide with a congregation:

The prayers in this guide can also be used during in person or online gatherings, such as Sunday morning worship services or prayer events. Here are some suggestions for how to make the most of them:

- Include one or two prayers each week in the congregational newsletter, either in text or by having someone in the congregation record the prayer on video.
- Beginning with the first prayer in this guide, feature a different prayer each week in the announcements portion of the church service. PowerPoint slides are available for many of these prayers at WeRespond.ca/75-Prayers.
- Use this resource as inspiration during the Prayers of the People portion of your service.
- Incorporate a prayer from one of PWS&D's partners in a sermon. Videos of these prayers are available to download at WeRespond.ca/75-Prayers.
- Designate a portion of the congregation's prayer meeting or other gathering to remember needs from around the world. Hand out the prayer guide to all in attendance and have volunteers take turns reading a prayer out loud.
