From Your Pastor

It is hard to believe that we are almost at the end of the Church Year. The Church Year ends on the last Sunday in November on what is referred to as Christ the King Sunday, or Reign of Christ Sunday. We also, celebrate Saint Andrew's day on this Sunday since St. Andrew's Day falls on November 30th. With the ending of one part of our year, we look forward to the coming season of Advent, the beginning of the Church Year.

Advent is a time of preparation for the birth of Jesus. It is a time much like Lent where we are making room for Jesus. In the retelling of Jesus' birth, we hear about how there was no room for Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem. Too often we are like the towns people of Bethlehem with not enough room in our lives for Jesus. Between the busyness of schedules and the allure of distractions, the work that needs to be done and the worries that fill our lives, the gifts that need to be gotten and the meals that need to be prepared, the cards and letters that need to be sent, the grieving we didn't realize we still needed to do, we can get lost and miss the gift of God with us, Emmanuel.

During Advent, each week we are invited to pause and reflect on what it means for Jesus to be born into our broken world and into the struggles that we face as people of God. In the lead up to Christmas, we are invited to focus on the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love that Christ brings into the world through His birth, His Life, His death, and His resurrection. Too often we look at these focuses of Advent and think of happiness, but happiness is a fleeting emotion. Each of these gifts is to reach deep into our very being of who we are as people, but more importantly, who we are before God. Christmas becomes the time when we in our brokenness come to witness and hold the divine child. It is a beautiful picture. Many times, we focus on Christmas because it seems like we are getting what we want.

It is interesting that through most of the Church's history, Christmas was the smaller of the two feast days or celebrations in the Church Year, the major one being Easter. Where Christmas confronts us with beauty and innocence, Easter confronts us with our own brokenness and ugliness and with the divine gift of grace and wholeness. In Easter, we get what we truly need, redemption and the power of God's faithful promise being realized. It is humbling. At Christmas, we think about holding baby Jesus. At Easter we realize He is truly holding us, and lifting us up out of our brokenness, our mundane, our blahness, and gives us new life and a new purpose. Advent and Christmas are important, they help us to focus on Jesus as we journey through life, but we must not stop here because they lead us into the event that truly opens up the doors to eternity.

May you humbly journey with the gift of Jesus through this upcoming Advent and Christmas season pausing to appreciate the gifts that He has given and is giving us daily.


