MESSAGE: Comforting God

What is the message from today's scripture?

Israel! My people! I chose you and I called you! You are this small, and I am this big, but still, I know you, I see you, and I will help you.

I saw you in the farthest ends and I went to pick you up and I brought you to my

place!

This is today's message.

How are you doing in this global pandemic? My heart is becoming sick and tired of staying home and I started to fear of this situation. I thought it would end much sooner, but the impact of this coronavirus is truly unknowable at this moment.

I am hearing sufferings from people because of this. Health issues, relational issues, financial issues, and spiritual issues. I hope and pray that we can overcome this difficult situation together.

This is Palm Sunday. It is the last week of Lent. And it is the Passion Week. We call this week Passion week because the suffering of Jesus was in this week. Jesus was mocked, beaten, betrayed, ashamed, crucified, and died.

If they don't observe the Lent, many churches try to remember Jesus in this Passion week for his sacrifice for us out of the love for us. So, as we suffer from staying home and from the fear of coronavirus, let us try to be calm and try to look upon Jesus.

When Jesus came to Jerusalem, people cried out for him. They welcomed Jesus. They put down the Palm tree and their clothes so Jesus did not step on the dirty ground. And they bowed down to him. People thought Jesus would save them. They did not have independence. They were governed by Roman authority. So, they thought Jesus would be their political leader and change their political situation. That is why they cried out "Hosanna."

Hosanna means "Save us, Lord." They cried out to Jesus to save them with wrong perspective. Surely, Jesus fed their hunger. Jesus healed with his healing power. Jesus taught the truth. So, they followed him. But, in few days, they were changed. They cried out to him, not "Hosanna," but, "Crucify him, crucify him." Out of anger

that Jesus was not their political leader. In this Passion week, let us remember what Jesus had to go through and what our expectation is to Jesus. May God open our hearts and eyes in this Passion week. So, we have the truth. May God's light shine in our hearts.

Today's sermon title is Comforting God. May God's peace and comfort fill your hearts through this message.

When you are stressed out, what do you do?

Years ago, when my wife and I only had our first child, I was a student and my wife worked full-time. So, I was the main caregiver. My mother lives with us, so when I was at school, she was able to take care of our first son. But, sometimes, I had to stay late and my wife had to stay late. We tried our best it didn't happen at the same time, but things happen. So, one day, she had something, and I had something. So, we both had to be out in the evening. You know what's amazing for kids, they don't know how to read the clock, but they have sense of time. My wife usually came back home around 6 o'clock. When I was with my son around that time, I can tell he was waiting for his mom. He looked at the door frequently and he couldn't focus on his play.

On that day, we both had to come home late, our son was not able to sleep. Out of the long wait, he was dissatisfied and stressed out from our absent. He was not able to sleep well that night. He clung to his mom all night. We have very very hard time comforting him. On the next morning, my wife had to go to work before my son was up. When he woke up, he woke up crying, badly. So I held him in my arms, heart to heart. I held him and comforted him.

How would you comfort a crying baby? What would you say to him?

I told him, "It's okay, it's okay. It's me your daddy. I love you. I will be with you. And I will hold you. You are safe. You are loved. You are okay. Everything is going to be fine.

I held him and told him this over and over for about 20 minutes.

Finally, he calmed down and we slept together a little more.

When I was comforting him, I thought, "Aha! This is what God is doing for me."

When I turn my eyes to something else, when I lose the focus from God, this is what my Heavenly Father would do to me. When I am so stressed out and when I don't know what to do, and when I become vulnerable, God would think, "This is my time to hold him. This is my time to come to him and comfort him. I will let him know that I am his God."

If a baby cries, would you just leave him alone until he stops crying by himself? The baby would be exhausted and tired by the time he stops crying by himself.

Not many of us would leave a crying baby alone.

Mere human would not leave a crying baby alone. Then, what about our Heavenly Father God?

So many are experiencing changed and challenges because of coronavirus. Businesses are different, schools are different, social life is different, and our church is different as well. Everything we planned is different because of coronavirus. How do you manage yourself in this? We are like a crying baby now. Every single person is experiencing changes and challenger. Every society of the whole wide world is

experiencing changes and challenges. We don't know what to come next. We don't know when the school will begin again. We don't know when we will be able to enjoy our favorite meals in restaurants. We don't know when we will be able to meet our favorite people and gather together and have fun. We don't know when we will be able to gather in our church building and worship God together and have our fellowship time.

Unforeseeable future. We are adults and we are not crying babies. But, what's different? We are trained not to cry and we are trained to accept challenges and changes. Just that. And we are the same as the crying baby, not knowing what to come and not being satisfied with this current situation.

What do we need is the same as what a crying baby needs.

We need comfort. We need love. We need to be accepted. We need to be encouraged.

Remember my son's story? When he was up with crying so badly, what did I do? Did I looked up the Bible to find out some best verses to read to him to comfort him? Or did I google how to stop a crying baby?

No, I did not go through the Bible or did not ask google.

I had my love for him already and I already knew what to say to him.

When I held him to comfort him, at the moment, I realized, "Oh God... I am yours. You would do the same to me as I do to my loving child."

What do you do when we get stressed out? When you are angry? Sick of your life? Depressed? Who do you seek? Where do you go?

What causes you become afraid? What makes you feel uncomfortable? Try to compare that with God's promise. Come to God and find out what God stores for

you. Go to the Bible and please get to know God. He is pouring out his love for you in whatever circumstance! Accept his love.

These are today's **Ponder Upon Questions.**
