Sermon : The Helmet of Salvation

Few years ago, my friend and I began to ride bicycle together. It wasn't planed. It was a spontaneous decision. One day, I met him near my home. Of course, I drove my car, but he rode his bicycle. O boy.. I asked, "How far did you ride?!" It took around 40 minutes for him to get to the place we met. He said that he was going to lose some weight. I wanted to lose some weight too, so I joined him. Do you know the first thing I did after I decided to ride a bicycle with him?

I purchased a helmet. I took my elder son with me when I went to Canadian Tire to get my helmet and his. We got so excited. My son put on his helmet when we went to daycare the next few days. Huhhuh. He loved his helmet. I love to ride a bicycle for all my life but I never thought of getting a helmet until that time. However, having a family and knowing how dangerous to ride a bicycle on the road with cars, this time, I decided to wear a helmet.

Around that time, there was a news about a 36 year-old-man involved in a skateboard accident. The official said, "It was a death that could have been avoided." He fell down and got a head injury. He suffered a skull fracture and other head injuries from the accident in a skate park. He suffered few days and died. If only he put on his helmet, he wouldn't even have to make the hospital trip.

Another news about helmet. This is a positive one. An 11 year-old-girl fell down into the path of the car. She was knocked down and she was unconscious. The wheels went over her arm and the top of her helmet. She could have been killed without the helmet. A helmet saved her life.

The existence of a helmet makes a huge difference. Someone lost his life, and someone saved her life. We don't use helmets in the same way as the ancient Roman soldiers, but the function is the same. It's to protect the head. We are protecting head from bumping on some hard surfaces when falling down from bike or skateboard. And the ancient Roman soldiers used helmets to protect their heads from enemies' attack. Swords, spears, arrows, and maces. If the head is not protected, one attack will take away one's life. The other pieces of armours are important as well, but the headgear is directly connected to life and death problem.

In Paul's mind, the helmet is the life and death issue. He talked about Salvation. Salvation basically means to be saved or delivered from something. In biblical usage, salvation generally refers to deliverance from the eternal death penalty of sin and deliverance into God's Kingdom. So, Salvation is the matter of death or life. People don't die from their foot injuries. Injuries of vital organs may take our lives away but it could be healed too. But head injuries may take our lives away with the highest chance.

We have truth in our hearts, our actions are righteous, and we make peace with God and people. We live by our faith. But, if we don't have salvation, what's the meaning of having all other armours and protecting ourselves? We've been so faithful to God, but no salvation? That means there's no meaning of life. Then, all the protections lose their meanings. Life or Salvation is the ultimate goal for protection. What is the salvation for Roman soldiers? It is to go back home safely. It is to be delivered from the battle field. Then, what's the meaning of the salvation for us, Christians? Just like the definition I introduced, The Christian Salvation is to be saved from the power of sin. It is to be freed from the consequence of sin. It is to turn away from our sins and turn to God. It is switching the sides from death to life.

Without helmet, we talked about we are exposed to the dangers of head injuries and eventually to death. What about spiritually? What is the spiritual death? What causes the spiritual death? *Romans 6:23, "For the wage of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."* This is a great summary of today's message. We sinned. All sinned. And what we get is the consequence of sin. And that leads us to death. What we deserve is death! No exception. The Bible says there is no one righteous in the eyes of God. But, what is the second part? *The gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord*. This is what salvation! We were on the side of death, but through Christ Jesus our Lord, we received the gift of God which is eternal life. We changed the side, from death to life. This is supported by *Romans 5:8-10, "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!"*

Our nature keeps pushing us to the sinful side. But, Jesus Christ through God's unfailing love pulls us toward him. This is what Romans 5 means. The helmet of salvation was put on us. But we keep trying to take off our helmets. We were set free from the power of death, but we try to go opposite way and we want to be under the power of death. That is why Paul cries out Romans5. We have been justified by the blood of Jesus Christ. Now we have life. Don't give away our lives and don't try to be God's enemies. Know the value of the blood of Jesus Christ. He put down his life for us, for our lives we have now! This is our Salvation. This is the way for salvation. Put on the helmet of salvation and receive life. There's more good news. This is not about us doing something. But, what God is doing for us. God's just character has to do something about our sins. It's God's justice. We need to be punished for our sins! But, on the other hand, God's loving and gracious characters had to do something about us being punished and being disconnected from him. That is why Jesus Christ became the solution of these two colliding characters of God. God's justice required the penalty for our sins. So, God's loving mercy provided the most incredible substitute, Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour, who was willing to die in our place. To be saved, we need a Saviour. So, for the salvation, we need to put on the helmet. In other words, we need Jesus in order to protect our head, our lives.

The first public appearance of Jesus was after the temptation in Matthew 4. The first public teaching of Jesus was "*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.*" "*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.*" "*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near.*" "So, be baptized and be saved." That was the message. Then, what is the meaning of being baptized? Presbyterians do not immerge into the water when being baptized, but Baptists do. They plunge themselves into the water fully and rise up from the water. I think that gives a wonderful image of death and life. In faith, we put ourselves to death and we rise up with the life of Jesus Christ. This means to clothe

with Jesus Christ. This is the confession that we are hopeless without Jesus. We are lifeless without Jesus. All we have in the end is death if we don't have Jesus Christ in our lives. So, we are going to die to our sinful selves, but have new life with Jesus. This is the confession from <u>Galatians 2:20</u>, <u>"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!"</u>

Where have we been heading so far? What direction have we been heading? What has been the goal of our lives? Happiness? Comfort? Financial stability? Health? Retirement? Family? These are all for this short life. How are we planning our eternity, which we received from God as a gift? It sounds like PUN, but our head decides our direction where we are heading. ARE we heading to the same direction as God's? Are we heading to the salvation? With the helmet on, it is hard to lose life. The salvation we received from God cannot be lost because it is God given. Let us be sure that we are protected with the Helmet of Salvation. We are protected from the discouragement, despair in this world, confusion, and all kinds of temptations of evil powers. Be bold because we have headgears. We are protected with the life of Jesus!

I will end my sermon with proclamations from the Bible. <u>Hosea 13:14, God says, "I will</u> <u>deliver this people from the power of the grave; I will redeem them from death. Where, O death,</u> <u>are your plagues? Where, O grave, is your destruction?"</u> // <u>1 Corinthians 15:55, "Where, O</u> <u>death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"</u> // <u>Psalm 27:1. "The Lord is my light and</u> <u>my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?"</u>

Let us pray.

God of salvation, God of life, thank you. Thank you for giving us life. We know it cost your life to give us life. But, you willingly provided us the life, and it's eternal. We studied the helmet of salvation. It's life-saving equipment. It's you that protect our lives. Because you are for us, nothing, no one can stand against us. We are fighting the battle which we already won. We already have the victory through you, LORD. Let us be encouraged. Let us live like victors. We are winners because we are with you, LORD. Thank you.

When we live in our daily lives, Lord, help us be bold. Help us be confident because of the life we have through you. There will be many many difficulties we are going to encounter. But, at that time, remind us that the battle is already won. Christ Jesus won the battle for us already. We praise you and thank you.

As the confession of Galatians, and just like the meaning of baptism, we want to die for our sinful selves and we want to live your life which you have given us. Please lead us through the week in your presence and power. Guide our steps always. In Jesus' powerful and precious name, we pray. Amen.
