Sermon: The Sword of the Spirit

Have you heard of Excalibur? What is it? It is the name of King Arthur's sword. We can imagine a picture of King Arthur standing with his sword along with his other protecting armours. Imagine that King Arthur named all of his armours. His belt is called something, his shoes are named something, and his breastplate has a special name too. For example, if his shield was named Sarcatosta, will it be able to represent his whole armour? Sarcatosta could be King Arthur's favorite among all pieces of his armours. However, we won't be able to imagine King Arthur is getting ready for the battle with his shield alone. But, interestingly, Excalibur, his sword, gives us the image of him standing for the battle. This is because the sword is the only offensive item. We remember the name of his sword because it represents his readiness for the battle. His boots might have a name too, but we don't remember the name of his boots because these are not offensive weapon. Protective items cannot represent the works that need to be done. The sword is the only item we can attack our enemies. Without sword... Imagine, if we are in the battle field without a sword. For our enemies, we are just moving targets. We don't have any capacity to attack them. In the battle, we are not just waiting for them to go away or for them to die by themselves. We need to get rid of our enemies with strong attacks with our swords. King Arthur might kill people with his shield by hitting them. But, killing is not the main purpose of the shield. The purpose of the shield is to support sword, so that the purpose of the sword can be accomplished. The purpose of the battle is to kill the enemies. The sword is the only item which we can achieve the goal.

Everything else is the supporter of the sword. What is our Excalibur? This Bible should be our Excalibur and we've been studying all other pieces of the Armour of God to accomplish the purpose of standing firm. It's to win over our enemy by using the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.



The sword represents the victory. Then, we need to know

what the sword of the Spirit is. The sword of the Spirit is the Word of God. There's a Christian cartoon. It's very short. One man called out to God. "Lord, please talk to me." Then, instead of answering, God handed him the Bible. That is it. This man asked God to speak to him, but God answered him by giving the Bible. "Here's the answer. This Bible is enough." The Bible is enough because it's the truth of God. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 1:22, "It is foolish to the Jews, who ask for signs from heaven. And it is foolish to the Greeks, who seek human wisdom." So when Paul preached that Christ was crucified, the Jews were offended and the Gentiles said it is all nonsense. Jews and Gentiles were not satisfied with Christ alone. They wanted to have some special signs from heaven and some special human wisdom. But, God says to us. The Word of God alone is what we need. Let us go back to the Bible, the truth, our only offensive weapon.

The function of the sword is to cut. Listen to <u>Hebrews 4:12</u>, "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit,

joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart." Sword is a big knife. What do we do with our knives? We cut stuff. We cut fruit, vegetables, meats, and paper, and erasers... all kinds of things! Sometimes, a very delicate focus is required. Especially, do you know the medical knife? Very small, but very sharp. Like the Bible says, this medical knife is able to cut very fine things like joints and marrow. And spiritual knife can cut thoughts and attitudes of the hearts. What's the difference of the soul and the spirit? There might be very small difference, but the sword of the Spirit can make division between them. What does this mean when the knife can cut very fine things? This means, through the knife, the core of the matter is uncovered. The honest truth is exposed through the knife. Sometimes, we don't know what we want or what we are feeing and what we are thinking. But, the sword of the Spirit can clearly distinguish our thoughts and our attitudes of the hearts. We don't know our needs and wants. The Sword of the Spirit discerns our needs and wants. The truth, the sword of the Spirit, the Bible, gives us the bright light so that everything uncertain in us can be exposed under the bright light of the truth. Through the sword of the Spirit, we can have the wisdom of discernment. Enemies confuse us. What do we do about the sex education these days? What do we say about coronavirus? What do we say about racism? How do we teach the truth to our next generation? Very difficult questions. We need wisdom. There needs to be clear cut. The sword of the Spirit will give us wisdom to stand strong with the truth and wisdom in difficult matters.

Do you know why we need to stand strong in the Lord? Because it's the happiest way possible we live as God's people, as God's creation. God wants us to live the best life – I sound like I am preaching prosperity gospel, but I don't mean material things. Think about our children. Don't we want them to live their best life? I do. Although my youngest is only about 80 days old, I still want him to live his best possible life. I want him to enjoy his infant life, fully. I want him to

have the best time wherever he is and whatever he does. What about our heavenly Father?! I believe our Heavenly Father loves us with the same heart. And do you know how to make the best life in this world? Who created this world? God! Who knows this world the most? God! Then, who has the best knowledge about life? God... And how does God speak to us?! Through the Bible!! And this is how we know what to do and how to live our lives. AMEN!? AMEN!!

Then, lastly, do we have the ability to use the sword of the Spirit? When going into the battle, who become the soldiers?

There's a battle, you, who works in the computer lap, come out and grab your sword!

You, who cook, come out and get your sword!

You, who clean the street, come and get ready to fight.

Did they do this? NO. The soldiers were trained. They learned how to put armours on them. They learned how to use their swords. They learned from the beginning, one by one, gradually. Just like we learn how to drive, they learned how to fight very slowly and carefully. How well do we use our swords? When driving, we get accustomed with our own cars. I am driving a Kia Soul. It has short front and short back. It's a box shaped car, so there is a very small trunk. I've been driving this car since 2010, so I can drive this small car pretty well. But, sometimes, I have to drive my mom's car. It's a Toyota Corolla. It's a normal shaped car with a long back with larger trunk. When doing the rear parking, I frequently make small bumps. Because I am not used to drive cars with a longer body. Once we are given the truth, the Bible, it's not enough. We need to be accustomed to it. When taking a course, having a textbook is not gonna give us A+ grade. We need to make it ours. We need to dig it and understand it. We need to digest it. We need to know what's in there and we need to have it in our hands and feet and in our lives.

It is like sharpening our knives. For example, a kitchen knife. When you want it to function properly, it should be sharpened regularly. Otherwise, it's gonna get dull. We don't get cut from a sharp knife. But, we cut our fingers from a knife that is not sharp enough. We have the truth, but we don't know how to use it, then it's not gonna function powerfully. It's not gonna give us the fully alive life. It's not gonna cut fine objects. It will lose its real power. The Bible says, the sword of the Spirit is the word of God and it is alive and active and it is sharper than any double-edged sword that can penetrates very fine things. Do we have that accuracy when we use the sword of the Spirit? When we apply the Bible in our lives, does it show the power of our Almighty God, is it inspiring and changing lives? Or is it like the whitewashed tombs like Pharisees in Jesus' time who were hypocrites? If we know the truth and don't act on it, then we are the same hypocrites.

Paul confessed his life's desire in <u>Philippians 1:20</u>, "I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." For Paul, Christ was enough. What about us? Is Christ enough for us? The Sword of the Spirit, the truth is given to us. How are we going to use this for our God- given-life? I hope and pray that we can make our lives most meaningful and we can offer up our lives as a pleasure for God's heart.

Our Father, thank you. Thank you for teaching us your heart. Thank you for your love and wisdom. And thank you for giving us the SWORD of the Spirit, the truth, the Bible.
