SERMON: The sheer gift of righteousness

Today's sermon title is "The sheer gift of righteousness."

The core message of today's Romans passage is that Abraham's faith supersedes the law. The law here is the teachings of God handed down through Moses. It certainly is important for them. It was their identity and even pride. The Jews thought their faith is only expressed by observing the law. In Romans 2, Paul argues. "17 But if you call yourself a Jew and rely on the law and boast of your relation to God 18 and know his will and determine what is best because you are instructed in the law, 19 and if you are sure that you are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, 20 a corrector of the foolish, a teacher of children, having in the law the embodiment of knowledge and truth, 21 you, then, that teach others, will you not teach yourself? While you preach against stealing, do you steal? 22 You that forbid adultery, do you commit adultery? You that abhor idols, do you rob temples? 23 You that boast in the law, do you dishonour God by breaking the law? 24 For, as it is written, 'The name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you.'

This shows that the Jews are hanging onto their laws, but Paul is asking them, <u>"ARE YOU</u>

<u>SURE THAT YOU ARE KEEPING ALL THE LAWS?"</u> We know what the laws from God. The Ten Commandments.

- 1. You shall have no other gods but me.
- 2. You shall not make unto you any graven images.
- 3. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
- 4. You shall remember the Sabbath and keep it holy.
- 5. Honour your mother and father.
- 6. You shall not murder.
- 7. You shall not commit adultery.
- 8. You shall not steal.
- 9. You shall not bear false witness.
- 10. You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbour.

All the LAWS for the Jews are originated from these 10 laws.

The Jews considered they were the descendants of Abraham and took the pride from it. So, their identity were the descendants of Abraham and the people of the Mosaic laws. The first part, being the descendants of Abraham, caused the division between them and all other nations. They had the mindset of the chosen people. They considered themselves somewhat better than others.

And the identity of the people of the Law resulted them to focus on their behaviours, not on their hearts. These two great blessings became the curse upon them. Being the chosen people to spread the Good News to all the earth made them proud and arrogant. Having the Mosaic laws, in order for them to realize the limitedness of human being, they lost the intention of God. God did not give the laws for us to pay our full attention to keeping the laws. What is the purpose of the laws? The laws show what beliefs and behaviours please God. By knowing the laws, we are to realize our weaknesses that we cannot meet the requirements of God to be righteous. It should tell us that we are not enough in obeying all of his laws. This should guide us to come to God in humility. But we lost our hearts relying on God, but we disguise ourselves that we kept all the laws.

This is why Paul cried out to the Jews in Romans 2. 21 you, then, that teach others, will you not teach yourself? While you preach against stealing, do you steal? 22 You that forbid adultery, do you commit adultery? You that abhor idols, do you rob temples? 23 You that boast in the law, do you dishonour God by breaking the law?

Paul knew the true purpose of the law and deeply agonized by his own people being blinded with the desires to be righteous before the eyes of God with the law.

That's why Paul is writing Romans 4.

V1-5, "What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? 2 For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. 3 For what does the scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness.' 4 Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. 5 But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness."

Paul is shifting the focus of the people. "Yes, we are the descendants of Abraham. But, you know what, Abraham became our faithful ancestor not by his work, but by his faith in God. God considered Abraham righteous because of his faith, not because of his work. If we could become righteous before God with our works, with the law, then why would Abraham be counted righteous before God with his faith?"

What is righteousness? The traditional definition of righteousness has been to live in a right relationship with God and with other people. So, all the laws are supposed to be applied to the relational point of view. Therefore, when we want to address the issue of the word righteousness, the emphasis should be on the relationship it points to. The relationship is with God, not God's laws. Laws are useful in telling us what beliefs and behaviours please God.

V15, For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. 16 For this reason it depends on faith,

Abraham's faith, not the laws, guarantees and activates God's promises.

God's grace is the proof for us that God chose to love us. This determination of God set us in a right relationship with God. And this grace is brought to us in Jesus Christ. **Martin Luther**, who led the Reformation, tried to be righteous by his good works for a long time. It took him a long time to discover that it is simply by faith that we enter into a right relationship with God.

<u>Then what is faith?</u> Faith is a challenging word. Tradition definitions are: <u>trust in God, beliefs</u> about God, and the way of life we are led into by faith. <u>In Paul's heart, the faith for Abraham was a willingness to trust in God.</u>

Once we realize that we are chosen by God with his grace alone, then we are able to confess our willingness to follow God. This awareness is also the gift of God.

Ephesians 2:8-9, 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— 9 not the result of works, so that no one may boast.

The righteousness we have now is solely from God. We need to know that we cannot even control our faith. Faith, the willingness to trust God, is also from God. Our life in God became righteous by the sheer gift of righteousness from God. We start from God and end with God. This is who we are.

This is the message of the Lord for us today.

<u>Communion At The Lord's Table</u> This is the time for Communion at the Lord's Table. God is with you! And God is with us all. Open wide your hearts. We open them completely to the Spirit of God. May God's love nurture your wandering spirits each day. May God's light sustain your souls each night. Let us confess our faith by saying the Apostles' Creed.

The Apostles' Creed (BOP 539)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

(Great Prayer of Thanksgiving:) (Please say BOLD print together)

L: The Lord be with you. P: And also, with you.

L: Lift up your hearts. P: We lift them to the Lord.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. P: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

L: Blessed are you Lord, strong and faithful God. All your works, the height and the depth, echo the silent music of your praise. All of creation sing your praise.
