SERMON: In the end (Weeds and the wheat)

Today's sermon title is "In the end (Weeds and the wheat)

Today, seed is a key metaphor. Last week, when a sower sows seeds, we didn't have to think about the quality of the seed. We assumed that all seeds are good.

But, today, there are two kinds of seeds. <u>V24-25</u>, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away."

Now, there are two kinds of plants.

One is good plant, wheat. The other one is weed. It is **bearded darnel**, so called **tare**. (PIC) Before wheat is ripe, young tare and young wheat look identical. So, the nickname of tare is "cheat weed." Ravenous wolves in sheep's clothing.

If it's only the look, this could be a small problem. However, tare roots surround the roots of good plants, sucking up precious nutrients and scarce water. Therefore, it is impossible to root it out without damaging the good crop.

Botanical version of parasite. Like a false prophet. This tare is a false wheat.

The servants asked the master, v27-29, "And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, "Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?" He answered, "An enemy has done this." The slave said to him, "Then do you want us to go and gather them?" But he replied, No; for in gathering the weeks you would uproot the wheat along with them."

What does it resemble? This false wheat is like our sin. A small sin is planted in our hearts, but it sucks up all our attention. For a month or so, I am not drinking coffee. I am trying to cut down my coffee. I am a coffee lover. But I felt like I was drinking too much, I was depended on coffee too much, so now I am doing an experiment. First, I had some headaches. I didn't think I would be able to survive without coffee, but I am okay with that. Like coffee addiction, or too much love for coffee, when we are dependent upon something too much, it is hard to stop. It is difficult to root something out from our life. Like alcohol, smoking, coffee, caffeine, energy drink, or even drug. Once we are addicted, it's nearly impossible to get rid of it.

Or the materialism saturated culture. That is, <u>Money is king.</u> Isn't this true to many moments in our lives? Deep inside our hearts, even if we don't admit it, we cannot get away from this idea. Because the only true King is God, we shouldn't take money as king. But, what's the reality of our life, our culture, our education system, politics, even science! Nothing can be free from the power of money. <u>Money should be neutral in value</u>. It's a means of our life, but it becomes the purpose of our life. That's materialism and that is sin.

Materialism is a great example of today's common sin. How deep, in our hearts, is this idea of materialism rooted? How deeply is this materialistic thought occupied in our daily lives?

In the midst of a wheat field, the sinful weeds are spread out. And this botanical parasite captures the core value, the root of the wheat. We need nutrients, but the weeds are taking our source of energy, our source of life, our full attention. We are surrounded by materialism. **Think about** what we are surrounded with. Are you surrounded with love, faith, hope, honesty, sincerity, patience, forgiveness? Or are you surrounded with greed, competition, lie, disguise, selfishness, hatred, betrayal, lustful desires, or ignorance?

How can we pluck out these messages of sinful nature?

We want to pluck them out from us. Like the servants, we love to see the weeds gone.

<u>V29</u>, "Then do you want us to go and gather them?" "Should we pull the weeds out?" But, the householder replied. "No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them."

What does this mean!?

Sin is too closely attached to God's people?? So, God cannot separate weeds from good plants? **God did it already.**

John 1:29, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"

Hebrews 9:26, "[Jesus] has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself."

Shepherd gathered all the sheep. Shepherd protects the sheep, provides good pasture and streams of water, and shelters them. Although God takes good care of us, we are like sheep gone astray. Isaiah 53:6, "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all."

Numbers chapter 21, when the people of Israel exiled from Egypt, they walked wilderness, the desert. There was no water, no food, but scorching sun in the day, and freezing cold at night. They complained against God and against Moses. God was angry and sent poisonous snake among the people. They were bitten and many died. So, people came to Moses again pleading to pray to God.

Numbers 21:7-9, "The people came to Moses and said, "we have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live."

God's people are supposed to be under the reign of God, but, in reality, we are under the power of our own sinful nature. In Numbers' story of bronze serpent, would you look at the serpent and live when you were bitten by a poisonous serpent? If so, would you look at the bronze serpent on the pole with humility and sincerity, in faith? OR would you just take a glance of it because there's nothing to lose?

Like last week, the sower sows his seeds in all kinds of soils because our God does not neglect anybody. God shows his love and grace to all people including evil ones.

Here, in our passage, the house master is God. And we think the field is the world. But, what if the field is a heart of one person. What is my heart is the field. What if your heart is the field. Romans 7:14-15, Paul writes, "For we know that the law is spiritual; but I am of the flesh, sold into slavery under sin. I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate."

Sometimes, our life is like the infested field, with weeds and wheat intertwined, in our souls, in our hearts, in our minds, and in our thoughts and actions.

Matthew 13:9 and 43 are exactly the same. When Jesus explained his parables, he finished his teaching with this. "Let anyone with ears listen!"

God's grace, love and patience are poured upon all people, but not everyone understands it. Not everyone can listen to the teachings of Jesus. But, at the same time, anyone can turn back to God.

<u>Psalm 145:8-9, "The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love.</u> <u>The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made.</u>

Did the householder separate which one is which and root out the bad ones? Not yet. Not just because it's hard to tell. He left both because he might want to give the opportunities.

God is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love. He waits. He is patient. So, we can turn back to him. The Lord is good to all. Not just people who faithfully obey, but also the people who don't even care about God. The Lord is good to all. The Lord loves all. The Lord waits for all.

Why don't we trust his love? Why don't we trust God's steadfast patience for his people? Our God sows good seeds everywhere as well as our God waits till the end, so we might have a chance to turn back to God.

Psalm 145:8-9, "The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love. The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made.

Let us trust his grace and compassionate heart for us.

This is the message of the Lord for us today. Let us pray.
