Sermon: The Manifestation of Jesus.

Happy new year everyone! I hope and pray that the love of God will fill your life and guide your every day with his wisdom.

Today's sermon title is "The Manifestation of Jesus."

Today is Epiphany Sunday. We remember and celebrate the appearance of Jesus Christ in human history. The manifestation of Jesus changed everything. May his presence be experienced in our daily lives.

When someone joins in our discussion, sometimes everyone goes silent. Sometimes, when we encounter somebody, we are just so glad and feel encouraged.

The manifestation of So-And-So gives us great feelings. OR the manifestation of so-and-so #2 gives us difficulties. We can easily think of these people.

What about us? When we come into a room, how others feel about our presence?

It is up to the relationships we have built with others.

When Jesus appears, in other words, when we meet Jesus, everything changes. PERIOD.

When we truly meet Jesus, we are changed by his presence and in his presence.

For example, in today's scripture, Genesis 1, God created the light. God separated the light from the darkness. God created an order from a chaos.

And, when a blind man who was born blind came to Jesus, Jesus opened his eyes.

And, when Jesus proclaimed the good news, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news," people believed the gospel, and they were saved or some of them refused. Jesus brought a life-changing change.

In the presence of Jesus, we are pushed to the corner to make a choice. To accept the change or not, that is the problem.

When Jesus was crucified and was risen, what did the disciples do? They were gathered in a room and trembled in the fear, not knowing what to do. Jesus came to them and comforted them. Twice. When Thomas was away and the other time, when Thomas was there with them. But, after meeting risen Jesus Christ, twice, what did the disciples do? They went back to fishing. They didn't know what to do, so they went back to their old habit.

Are we so different from them?

Jesus comes to us and touches our hearts. We are moved by the Holy Spirit. We sense that God is calling us to live out the gospel. God is calling us to spread out the good news and shine the light of Jesus to our surroundings. This is good, but after some time, it becomes too difficult to keep going. So, we go back to our old life.

2 Corinthians 5:17, So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

18, All this is from God, whom reconciled us to himself through Christ.

In the presence of Christ, through Christ, we become new.

Once we have Christ, we are new. We have experienced the newness of ourselves when we encounter Jesus and when we stayed in the presence of Christ. But, we also experience backsliding.

To me, I sometime imagine myself climbing up the empty cross, looking for the things Christ has removed already. "Oh where is my selfish pleasures? Where is my darkness? Evil desires? Where is my hatred?" You know, when we hate somebody, we hate that emotion, but at the same time, we kind of enjoy it. Don't we? We sit in the negative emotions. We stay in it and we are struggling because of it, but, at the same time, we take some kind of contentment.

But, imagine this with me. When we work out in a hot summer day, what's going to happen? We sweat. Sometimes, when I wear dark T-shirt, there's white sweat stain all over the shirts. It's sweat soaked.

Then what do we do? We take that off and take a shower and cleanse ourselves.

After taking a shower, after making ourselves clean, what do we do?

Do we pick up the sweat-soaked-t-shirts again and wear it OR do we get a clean shirt?

Romans 13:11, "For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the

armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

After we take a shower, we want clean shirts, not sweat soaked shirts again.

Mark 4:9 states the baptism of Jesus. When John the Baptist was giving baptism to the people, Jesus joined the line-up. Their baptism was not just sprinkling few drops of water like we do. But, they immersed themselves completely into the water. When you go down under the water, can you breathe? Can you survive in the water without breathing?

This going down under the water stands for the death. When we are baptized, this symbolized the death with Christ. This stands for the passing away of our old selves.

And after few seconds, from the water, Jesus comes up out of the water. This stands for the new life. We are rising up with Christ with our new life. "Behold, if anyone is in Christ, she or he is a new creation. The old has passed away, the new is here."

The sweat soaked t-shirt is gone into the laundry basket, we are now going to clothe ourselves with a new clear t-shirt.

How do we become new? Who brought the newness? Jesus Christ, by his death and resurrection.

Whenever we do the laundry, whenever we take off our dirty clothes, think about our old selves. Whenever we take a shower and dress ourselves with the new and clean clothes, think about the newness that Christ brought to us.

The manifestation of Jesus brought this change.

V10, "And just as [Jesus] was coming up out of the water, he saw the heaven torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

Please imagine this scene with me. Jesus was standing in the water, from heaven a dove coming down toward Jesus. And the voice of God saying to Jesus.

Jesus brought the Triune God out of the Heaven to earth. On earth, where we live, Jesus is there, the Holy Spirit is there, and God the Father is present with his voice.

Jesus brought heaven down to us. In the presence of Jesus Christ, let us have heaven in our hearts. We became new, so the Kingdom of God is ours to enjoy.

The first question and answer of the Shorter Catechism are well known. "What is the chief end of man? To glorify God, and to enjoy him forever."

In the presence of God, let us accept him, let us glorify him and let us fully enjoy him.

This is the message of the Lord for us today.

The Apostles' Creed (BOP 539)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

<u>I believe in</u> Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. <u>On the third</u> day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

<u>I believe</u> in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, <u>the resurrection</u> of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

(Great Prayer of Thanksgiving:) (Please say BOLD print together)

L: The Lord be with you. P: And also, with you.

L: Lift up your hearts. P: We lift them to the Lord.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. P: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

L: It is right and meet, beautiful and holy that we should, in ceaseless joy, give our thanks and praise to you, Holy and merciful God, through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. In grateful procession of endless praise with the church that is, was, and shall be forever, we glorify you, joining this unending praise. We lift our hearts in joyful praise:

You sent to us your own child, Jesus, who reached into unexpected places, calling women beyond the limits of their times, equipping men for nurturing love, welcoming children into your holy embrace. With this amazing grace and love, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

P: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

L: O God, you transform. You transform all that is before you, so that at the touch of your grace, we are never the same. O God, you illumine. You bring light to all peoples. Light to the nations, light into our hearts. Light on your Way. Holy Spirit, make these ordinary gifts of bread and cup into the extraordinary presence of Christ with us. Through Christ, by Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour are yours, almighty God, for ever and ever. Amen.
