## **SERMON: Dance before the Lord**

Thank you for your support and prayer while I was away. And thank you for your support making church possible with Rev. Tim Walker last week.

Last week, in my vacation, my family went to a Christian <u>family retreat (PIC)</u> with 7 other couples. Of course, we first met there. It was a retreat centre in a small village Combermere, Ontario, run by Madonna House. Madonna House is a Catholic Community of laymen, women, and priests living together. They built their own town, farms, and workplaces. They work together to make living and share all the belongings with each other and build a healthy and loving Christian community.

Their main focus of living is restoration in Christ. They focus on poverty, chastity, and obedience. First, poverty. We had daily gatherings. A leader of the retreat explained poverty. She said, they not only help the poor, but they themselves become poor.

I was so shocked by her first words. Becoming poor? I never thought of this concept. No, I don't want to be poor. That was my first reaction.

Remembering the poor, they try to use minimal resources. For example, this is their everyday washroom and our washroom for the week. <u>(PIC)</u> In order to join the poverty and suffering of the poor, they do not use our usual washroom. Outside the toilet, there is a <u>bucket(PIC)</u>. They put clean water. Using scooper, they use a basin as their sink to wash their hands. Furthermore, to remember the unprivileged, they limit themselves having some food. <u>White bread and butter</u>

(PIC) are only allowed on Sundays. They have resources. They have farm and livestock. But, they limit their lifestyle to make themselves poor in the way of helping poor. They maintain humble and modest lifestyle in following the path of Jesus Christ.

Second, <u>chastity (PIC of chapel)</u>. Because it's a Catholic community, they do not get married. They desire to give their full attention to God alone. On the lake, when they swim, they divided men side and women side. Third, obedience. When they were asked for help, they do not ask a question, but go and help. When they are asked, they obey. They try to live the lifestyle of Jesus.

Another leader shared his story. He has been living in Madonna House for 38 years. One day, when we was early 20's, he asked God. <u>"God, what can I do for you with my life?"</u> Then, he felt that God wanted him to give his life to God. His life. So, he gave his life to God. This means, he gave up the career he could have had. He gave up his own family he could have had. No marriage. No children. He gave up possessions, positions, achievements, and other experiences we enjoy daily. He truly embraces the presence of God with his whole life.

This shocked me. I thought I gave my life to God becoming a minister. Yes, in a way, I gave my life to God. We all have given our lives to God in our own ways. But, what he shared was just too much for me, to put me in his shoes. Will I be able to give up what I am enjoying right now? Comfort of the washroom? Daily available white bread and butter? Wife? Kids? Can I become poor like that? Can I be pure like that? Can I embrace God with my whole heart, like him?

In today's 2 Samuel passage, we are talking about <u>King David</u>. A King. This implies that the king lacks nothing. He has all the things he needs and wants. He can have everything he wants whenever he wants. In the middle of the night, if he wants to eat a juicy medium rare steak, then his cook must get it ready for him. If he woke up at 4 o'clock in the morning, there should be someone who could attend for him. That's King's life.

Today, King David is bringing the Ark of the Lord to the temple. The Ark of the Lord stands for the presence of God. But, it was taken away in a battle before. Now, finally, Israelites are able to restore the presence of the Lord amongst themselves by bringing the Ark of the Lord back to Jerusalem. So, it was a joyful and celebratory day.

**V5, "David and all the house of Israel were dancing before the Lord with all their might."** This shows the joy and happiness of God's people when they embraced the Lord with their whole hearts.

This is great. But, there was an issue of David's outfit of the day. The Bible states that David was girded with <u>a linen ephod</u>. <u>On this picture</u>, there are three kinds of clothing. It is a general understanding that a linen ephod is <u>"loincloth."</u>

<u>So, David was almost naked (PIC)</u> when he welcomed the ark of the Lord with his own people. The Bible does not explain why David was clothed in this way.

All we can infer from our scripture is that David was not dancing and playing before the people but the Lord alone. Like a child, with an overwhelming joy, David danced with all of his might to express his love and loyalty to the true King, God. <u>Does anyone know David's nickname?</u> <u>A man after God's own heart.</u>

After David died, when his descendants became kings, God keeps asking them to be like David. For example, <u>1 King 11:38, "If you will listen to all that I command you, walk in my ways,</u> <u>and do what is right in my sight by keeping my statutes and my commandments, as David</u>

# my servant did, I will be with you, and will build you an enduring house, as I built for David, and I will give Israel to you."

If we focus only on how David was dressed, then we are missing the whole point. How David was naked is not an issue for God. But, God looks at his heart. As King, David did not look for some public admiration. If he did, he wouldn't be able to dance with all his might. He would have to learn some steps and movements to show the best dancing skills as king. My guess is David stripped off all of his positions and all of his expectations from the people. But, at this time of worshipping God, David was only offering himself to God. He only focused on God. On this joyful and glorious day that the ark of God was coming back, David was simply welcoming the presence of God with his whole heart. His heart was filled with the presence of God. He does not have any space for something else.

On the other hand, in v16, David's wife, <u>Michal looked out of the window. She saw King</u> <u>David leaping and dancing before the Lord; and she despised him in her heart.</u> Her heart was filled with scorn against David. She was filled with contempt for David.

The Bible writes *King* David. The Bible specifically highlights David's social position. King David was leaping and dancing. But, when the Bible writes about Michal, it refers her daughter of Saul. Michal was the queen, the wife of David. But, the Bible makes sure that Michal was on different side from David. There is an imaginary line between David and Michal. **V20, David returned to bless his household. But Michal the daughter of Saul came out to** meet David, and said, "How the king of Israel honoured himself today, uncovering himself today before the eyes of his servants' maids, as any vulgar fellow might shamelessly uncover himself!'

In this statement of Michal, the daughter of Saul, what is the focus? What does she focus on? She focused on David's position. David's honour. David's fame. David's reputation. How people would think of David as king.

When was this happen? On the day of great joy before the presence of God. The Ark of the Lord is coming back today! In the presence of God, what is Michal focusing on? Other people. Self-admiration. Her own security. NOT GOD.

When we worship God, are we like David or Michal?

What are we holding in our life?

Remember the leader from my family retreat who gave his life to God, giving up the things we could have had? When we worship God, what matters the most? Can we focus on God alone like David? Can we focus on God, not the things we enjoy daily?

Ask God for joy of your salvation and worship God freely like dancing in your own ways. I hope and pray that during the week, on your own time of worship, dance before the Lord in your own way of worshipping God. May God restore the joy of salvation in your hearts.

This is the message of the Lord for us today.

You did not spare your own son Jesus Christ to give us life. When we do not deserve your love or your kindness, you call us and you came to us. Even though we keep run away from you, you still come to us and you still love us. You never give us up. You never let us go. You never stop loving us. We are so used to receiving your love. We pray for our church people. If there are sicknesses, grant them healing. Use the medicine they take and use the medical assistants including doctors and nurses. Place the true hope in the centre of their hearts. We pray for the people with conflicts and brokenness. Pour out your love upon them. Give them strength to love you. Help them love themselves. Let them fill their cups first, so that they can experience overflowing of your love in their lives. Let them overflow. There are people with prayer needs. Listen to their prayers and work in our lives through the Holy Spirit.

In all we do, be glorified and be pleased. We love you and we worship you. In Jesus' precious and wonderful and powerful and beautiful name, we pray. Amen.
